

DISASTROUS HAILSTORM.

Heavy Loss of Crops Caused in Arizona Settlements.

To the People Have Harassed a Good Year, and the Place Offers Great Indemnities to sufferers.

Snowflake, August 8, 1895.

Editor General News.
Our locality was visited with the most disastrous hailstorm on Tuesday, the 8th inst., that has ever been, by way of us. The storm approached from the southwest about 4 p.m., and destroyed nearly everything in its path. Considerable grain was standing up, owing to the lack of sufficient machinery to harvest it. Every stalk and ear of corn was brought into requisition, and all the supply of grain held up, and was very ripe. In a few minutes after the storm struck, many of our supplies of grain were worth next to nothing, because broken. It appears that three hours was all that time given to harvest the standing grain. Much grain was threshed out of that which was ruined and broken. Corn, peaches, all kinds of garden stuff, and wild fruits that had been gathered for market, were knocked off with the stones from the trees. The tools and equipment will cost from \$2,000 to \$3,000.

Our prospects were very bright previous to this event, and, particularly, so the farmers worked carefully over the winter, a general feeling of despondency seemed to pervade them. Yesterday and today, many heavy rains were made, and we have had a good deal of rain since. The clouds are moving away to the west.

Taylor was damaged by the fall to the extent of \$1,000, and I am afraid that our country has suffered to consequence of a prolonged drought, but the time now begins to look green, and there is a prospect of some grain for cattle and sheep.

The results of the disaster of recent have been most tragic, and those who wanted to move away to that far country just beyond somewhere. Many have already gone, and more going, and now we hear of whole places to be abandoned. The people here are very poor, and want to have a home in one of the most prosperous settlements of the State, to make a good living. There will, no doubt, be a condition to start this, as the valley seems now to be a desert, and the people here, and those who stay, grow green rather than usually raised here. This, together with the fact that we are used to some kind of suffering, will enable us to help ourselves together, and by the time the new season comes, we do not again, and are along in the procession.

Closing Exercises of the Event—Sect Session to be Held at St. George.
