#### THREE POWERS NEEDED.

Steam, Electricity and Gravity Used to Haul Ore Short Distance.

Frederick Lyon, general manager of the Mammoth company at Kennett, California, a United States Smelling corporation, is in this city. He reports that a haaling scheme is being rushed, which when completed will have a ca-pacity of 150 tons per hour.
