The agents of the Hamburg-American Company are confident that all the passengers will be well cared for.

St. Johns, N. B., 9.—The Herder went ashere at the eastward head of Long Beach, about three miles west of Cape Race, at 2 o'clock this morning during a dense fog. All of the passengers and craw landed without accident, and they were brought here by special steamer and cared for by the German consul. It is believed the ship and cargo will be a total loss.
