CITY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

At the meeting of the board of education tonight Superintendent Milesburgh will submit his report on the attendance of pupils at the city schools for the month of September. It will show an average registration of 9,227, of which number 4,174 are boys and 5,053 are girls. The daily average is 8,877, the girls numbering 4,581 and the boys 4,296, while the average daily absence is 980, at which 4,044 were girls and 1,934 were boys. Neither street nor parochial were closed. The report also gives the percentage of attendance to have been 95, that is, punctuality 95 per cent. The original enrollment for the month was 9,377, of which number 4,162 were girls and 5,215 boys. Belonging to the city schools the students numbered 9,227, of which 4,581 were girls and 4,646 boys. The report further shows the presence of 369 colored children and two Chinese in the schools. The increased attendance is gradual and steady and before many weeks have passed every addition to the school will be crowded to the utmost capacity.

SEPTEMBER TEMPERATURE.

Report of the Utah Weather Service for

September, 1895.

Temperature.—The mean temperature for the Territory was 60.5 degrees; highest monthly mean, 70.2 degrees, at St. George; lowest, 52.4 degrees, at Grassy Creek. The highest temperature, 103 degrees, was recorded at St. George, on the 5th, and the lowest, 2 degrees, at Fillmore, on the 22nd, making the range of temperature for the Territory 94 degrees. The greatest monthly range of temperature was 90 degrees, at Fillmore, and the least, 62 degrees, at Logan. The average maximum temperature was 91 degrees, and the minimum, 22 degrees.

PRECIPITATION.

The average precipitation for the Territory was .60 of an inch; greatest monthly amount recorded was 2.23 inches at Millville, and the least, .01 at Grassy Creek.

The principal part of the precipitation was in the shape of snow which fell on the 20th and 21st. The average number of days on which snowfall occurred at St. George, was 10.
