The government estimates that the show of famine in Bombay will gradually increase, reaching a maximum in April, when 1,00,000 persons will require relief. After which it will gradually decrease. In Madras the prospect is proportionately worse. The districts affected in Madras cover 80,000 square miles, and con tain a population of 18,000,000. In Bombay the famine-stricken territory covers 54,000 square miles, and has a population of 8,000,000, 5,000,-000 of which are in districts more immediately afflicted.




