LOCAL BRIEFS.

Rich Wants Water—Ben E. Rich of Centerville, has filed application with the state engineers for four second feet of water from Farmington creek with which to operate a 24 inch wheel for running machinery in Davis county.

Official Call Received—A copy of the official call for the Trans-Mississippi Commercial congress to be held in Kansas City, Mo. from Nov. 24 to 28, was received by Gov. Cutler yesterday and he was asked to name delegates to represent Utah at the congress.
