### THE ELECTIONS REPEAL BILL.

**WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 8.**—The movements even in the Senate this week will be the attempt to secure continuous session of that body. That the attempt will produce results can hardly be doubted by any one familiar with the situation.

The general desire, as well as belief, in the chamber, is that the present week will bring a solution of the problem. The opinion expressed is that there will be a compromise some measure agreed to and put through. The prospect to steadily extend the franchise to the colored portion of the reduced number of persons seems to be taking shape as the most likely of the various propositions to receive approval. The prospect to include both purchases and a reduction of the present minimum suffrage seems to while many Democrats may not agree to such a proposition, it may be yet through the assistance of the Republicans.

The authors of the other propositions are equally anxious to act and succeed with as to the terms of the agreement, but they will not be allowed to dictate the matter of compromise. What the colored men want is not the most favorable outcome, but a continuation of the present bill.
