New York, Dec. 12.—A cable to the World from Yokohama says: The Japanese troops entered Fort Arthur on November 21 and massacred practically the entire population in cold blood. Defenses were abandoned and the bodies unrecognizably mutilated. There was an unsparingly reign of murder which continued for three days. The whole town was plundered with unfeeling brutality. It was the first time since the Japanese civilization. The Japanese in this instance displayed barbarism and all pretenses that the circumstances justified the atrocity are false. The civilized world will be horrified by the details. The foreign correspondents, horrified by the spectacle, left the city in a hurry.
