the rough texture. These gowns are

both plain and elaborately trimmed,

short for street wear and long for carriage use. They may be made less somber by colored furs, piping of color or lace accessories.

An authority asserts that spring

suits will show a tendency to a revival

of 1830 modes. Skirts are a bit fuller

than they have been during the winter,

and hip yokes will form part of the

newest model. Long shoulders will con-

tinue to be fashionable. The three-

quarter coat bids fair to be the

biggest hit of the season. Many of

the jackets will be without collars,

white others will be finished with small

mannish turnover collars and narrow

revers. Tweeds, cheviots, coverts, fine

broadcloths and light weight sateen,

will be the favorite fabrics.

A dark lace-trimmed coat made

with a long semi-fitting coat has a

large collar and a belt.

A dark rose, thistle and wheat

design will be seen, as well as

dotted and cross stitch motives. The

Jacquard cotton will again be used.

This material in itself is quite elaborate

and requires little trimming. The lin-

gerette blouse will be even more popular

than the former years, and it will be

made beautiful with tucks, feather

stitching, ruffles and embroidery.

Cuffs will be fastened like the blousons,

also in elbow patches, and fastened with

crochet buttons. Old waist are de-

signed to hold their own in the realm of

fashion. While is the most correct se-

lection, and the design of the blouse

cannot be too elaborate, many of the

handsomest bodices being composed of

real lace. Real lace, of course, is very

beautiful but many of the imitations

are just as effective.

The new blouses are buttoned up

the back and in front. There is a

and lace blouses will be used for blousons

in combination with lace medallions and insertion.

embroidered and inset with medallions of lace and embroidery. They are so

complete in themselves that they re-

quest no extra trimming, and conse-

quently are not in the end very ex-

pensive, although the first cost is con-

sequently high.
