

## REPRESENTATIVE FILIPINOS WANTED

Secy. Taft Presents Reasons at  
Cabinet Meeting Why a New  
Lot Should Come.

## CROWD AT ST. LOUIS VERY POOR

Better Class of Natives Feel That  
They Are Not Properly Repre-  
sented at the Fair.

Washington, May 27.—Several mat-  
ters of importance were considered at  
the cabinet meeting today. It was de-  
cided, on the suggestion of Secy. Moody,  
that hereafter neither the president nor  
the navy department would entertain  
appeals from applicants for admission  
from the decision of the medical ex-  
amining board. Heretofore it has been  
a practice of such applicants as were  
declared by the medical board to be  
physically disqualified to carry their  
case to the president or the navy de-  
partment in the hope of having the  
decision of the board overruled.

Secy. Taft presented some of the rea-  
sons for bringing to the United States  
a delegation of between 40 and 50 high  
class educated Filipinos. The better  
class of natives felt that in the ex-  
hibit of natives at the St. Louis expo-  
sition the population of the islands was  
not represented fairly as the Filipinos  
at the fair were composed largely of  
representatives of the wild and un-  
civilized tribes.

Secy. Wilson of the department of  
agriculture reported the discovery of  
the ant in Guatemala with which it is  
hoped to eradicate the boll weevil.

## Board of General Appraisers.

New York, May 25.—Judge Townsend  
in the United States circuit court has  
announced his decision reversing the  
board of United States general appraisers  
in a test case brought by importers  
of fancy cotton cloths.

The question involved was whether  
cloths containing threads other than the  
ordinary warp and filling, introduced to  
form a design, or for the purpose of  
ornamentation and suitable as count-  
able cottons under the ad valorem  
duties of the Dingley law, are subject  
to an additional duty because of the ex-  
tra threads. Judge Townsend holds  
that they are not. Between \$400,000 and  
\$500,000 in excess duties will have to  
be refunded to the importers at the de-  
cision is sustained by the circuit court  
of appeals.

## THE LILY PARK RANCH.

Land Office Holds That Title Is Vested  
in Wells, Fargo & Co.

By a decision in the United States  
land office at Glenwood Springs, Colo.,  
yesterday, the title to the famous Lily  
Park ranch, located in Rout county,  
Colo., was held to be vested in Wells,  
Fargo & Co., who purchased the same  
from the original owner, George M.  
Scott, who, with John W. Lowell, ex-  
pended about \$200,000 in fencing and  
improving the ranch, which consists of  
about 3,000 acres of land.

The ranch has been fenced and under  
cultivation for a number of years, but  
about two years ago a surveying party  
passed through that section of the  
country and discovered that the land  
enclosed was on government ground.  
The ranch foreman heard of this, and  
with 25 others homesteaded the en-  
tire tract and took possession with  
their families. An attempt was made  
in the Federal court to eject the home-  
steaders but the court would take no  
action in the matter because the land  
still belonged to the government.  
The case was then placed in the hands  
of Higgins & Senior, of this city, who filed  
a contest against the homesteaders in  
the land office at Glenwood Springs.  
It seems that the original homestead-  
ers of the land had made errors in giv-  
ing the descriptions of their land when  
applying for patents. The descriptions  
which they gave did not cover the land  
on which they located, but covered  
tracts in the nearby mountains and the  
patents were issued to cover the latter  
land. In the protest filed, Wells, Fargo  
& Co. asked that the descriptions of

## COPPER BELT ROAD MAY CHANGE HANDS

Negotiations Under Way for the  
Sale of the Scenic Line  
Of Utah.

## J. C. JACOBS WANTS TO BUY IT

It is a Good Property, at Present Haul-  
ing 1500 Tons of Ore to the  
Smelters.

For several days past it has been  
affirmed among a little circle of Salt  
Lake business men that the Copper  
Belt railroad at Bingham was about to  
pass into new ownership, that of Mr.  
J. C. Jacobs, the owner of the Salt  
Lake & Mercur and while Mr. Jacobs  
admitted there had been some negotia-  
tions the price was not agreed to and the  
results were in doubt.

Mr. Jacobs when seen this morning,  
practically admitted that negotiations  
were under way but declined to dis-  
cuss the matter.

The owners of the Copper Belt road  
know they have a good property  
as Mr. Jacobs is certainly familiar with  
railroads of this character. It must have  
looked good to him.  
The Copper Belt railroad is owned  
by William Bayly, Sr., of Los Angeles  
and is one of the engineering feats of  
the country. It would be hard to say  
how many curves there are on the  
seven miles of road from the mines in  
Bingham canyon to the smelters, but  
when it is stated that some of the  
curves run as high as 40 per cent curve-  
ature and the grade averages 400 feet  
to the mile some idea of the under-  
taking can be arrived at.  
As a revenue earner the road is a  
paying proposition and already handles  
1500 tons of ore a day with 1,500 more  
daily in sight.

## RAILROADS AND LIVESTOCK.

National Association Issues a Circular  
Letter on Subject.

Denver, May 25.—The National Liv-  
estock association has issued a circular  
letter to its members upon the sub-  
ject of railway transportation. In part  
the letter says:

"That good service at the hands of  
railway companies is the thing most  
desired by all shippers, but the return  
pass is not the 'insignificant item' as  
it has been termed by some. This item  
means an annual saving of \$50,000 to  
the Texas and \$40,000 to the Montana  
cattleman and sum almost a large  
to the sheep growers of Wyoming,  
Idaho and Utah.

"It takes time for railway companies  
to accurately estimate the thousands of  
miles of line. However the promises  
made to the committee of the National  
Livestock association to abrogate the  
tonnage system in hauling livestock is  
being realized.

Reports from nearly every western  
state are to the effect that the service  
has wonderfully improved, and that  
the railways are honestly endeavoring  
to give entire satisfaction. Advice  
from all the eastern markets are that  
the service in time and prompt delivery  
is now better than it has been at any  
time for several years past.  
"If it is possible to get the interstate  
commerce amended as provided for in  
the constitution, the trouble of the  
shippers of livestock will be mini-  
mized. The national live stock asso-  
ciation, for four years, has been aiding  
the cause of the livestock shippers by  
convention to secure the enactment of this  
amendment.

"The attention of the traffic man-  
agers has been called to the inequality  
in livestock rates from the trouble of  
localities. They have agreed to a hearing  
on this subject, and it will be taken up  
by this association as early as the data  
can be gathered with which a case can  
be maintained."

A copy of the above circular was re-  
ceived through the mail by the "News"  
today. In addition to a number of

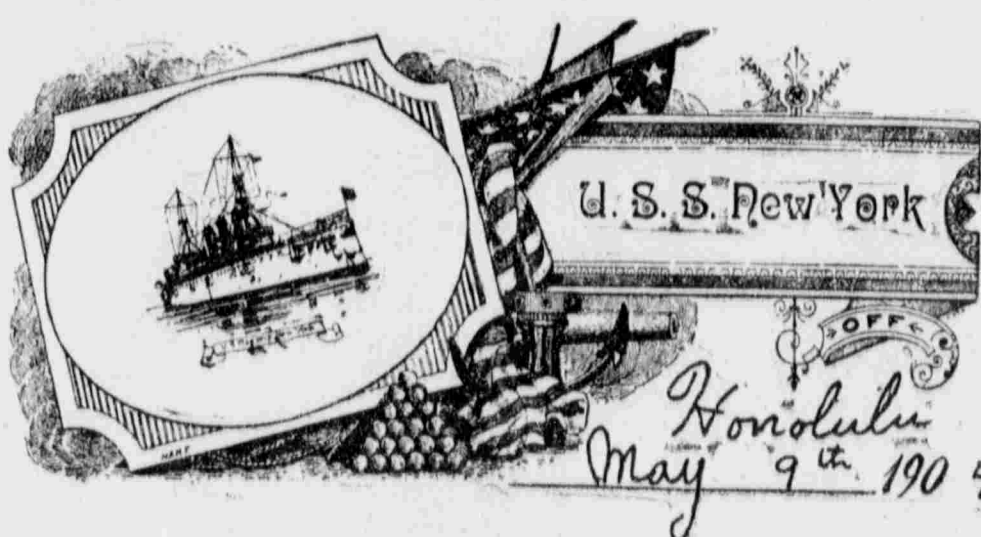
