

RELATIVES ARE SOUGHT.

Police Are Asked for Information About Charles McDonald.

Chief of Police Barlow received a letter this morning from J. F. Cory, deputy sheriff at Castle Gate, asking the department here for information concerning a colored man who was found dead about 7 o'clock yesterday morning on the railroad tracks on the D. & R. G. road. The letter stated that the man was found at mile post No. 333, and that death was evidently due to

heart failure as there were no marks on the body and no evidence of violence. Among the dead man's effects were a couple of Pullman car receipts, a transfer and a card on which was written the name "Charles McDonald." The man was about 45 years of age and it is believed he has a connection living here. The police have been unable, so far, to locate any relatives.

YOUNG CLERK IN JAIL.

E. G. Collier, who has been employed as a clerk at the Salt Lake Hardware

store, was arrested last evening on the charge of petit larceny. The arrest was made by Detectives Golding and Wilson, just after the store closed for the night. Collier was taken to police headquarters where he furnished a bond of \$5 for his appearance in Judge Bowman's court.

For some time the management of the store has been missing articles and suspicion fell upon young Collier. This police department was asked to detain him on the case and last evening the two officers watched the place. Collier was seen to leave carrying a bundle under his arm. When placed

under arrest it was found that he had a wrench, a pair of spurs and several other articles. He refused to make any statement whatever about the case. His parents furnished bail of \$5 and he was released.

RATES FOR ENCAMPMENT.

At the meeting of passenger men representing the roads centering in Salt Lake held this morning it was decided to make the same rate as that used for the April and October conferences, known as the "conference rates" of

Heart disease is assigned as the cause of death. He is a son of C. J. Schmidt, and was born here April 21, 1903. He was a normal graduate of All Hallows College, and during the present season was a musical director at Grantsville. He was a member of Hold's band and was

a musician of much ability. Arrangements for the funeral have not been completed.
