

TAFT IN PRAISE OF CONSTITUTION

Has an Abiding Faith in it as it is: Marvelously Framed by Patriots and Lawyers.

IT MEETS ALL CONDITIONS.

Others find it hard to understand But Americans Love the Indestructible Union of Indestructible States.

Plattsburg, N. Y., July 7.—New York state's share in the tercentenary celebration of the discovery of Lake Champlain reached its climax today. Tomorrow the scenes of pageantry, the parades, the speech-making, the interchange of compliments among France, Great Britain and the United States, who shared in the history-making of the Champlain country, will all be transferred across the lake to Vermont, and Burlington will have its fling.

President Taft, Ambassadors Jussier and Bryce, with Gov. Hughes and Gov. Prouty, again today occupied the center of the celebration stage. Each made three speeches and all were at the brilliant banquet at the Hotel Champlain tonight. Senator Root was among the prominent guests today, and made a historical address at Plattsburg barracks.

Postmaster-General, Theodore Roosevelt of Canada also spoke at the barracks, and, with Senator Root and others, spoke again tonight at the banquet, where the expressions of friendly good-will among the three great nations participating in the tercentenary were emphasized.

At the banquet tonight, President Taft, speaking to the toast, "The United States," declared that the United States constituted the most conservative nation in the world. In his speech at the banquet the president declared his policy as to the federal government, saying that while he believed an enlargement of central authority might be necessary he had an abiding faith in the Constitution and in the indestructible union of inde-

structible states. The president said in part:

TAFT'S ADDRESS.

"The foreign affairs of the United States are committed to the central government; but the state of New York and the state of Vermont have taken a step which will prove, and is proving, most important in our foreign relations. They have strengthened the bond that exists between the United States and Great Britain, the United States and France, and the United States and Canada."

"And now to the subject which has been assigned me—The United States. I think it is not too much to say that those who have studied our country, our civilization, our Constitution and our people, will reach the conclusion that there is no country in the world more conservative than the government of the United States. In view of the changes which are taking place in governments, in view of the new doctrines which are being advanced of a socialistic character, I think that it is one of the most important things to emphasize with reference to the United States."

"I do not mean to say that we are not progressive in the sense that we do not intend to keep up with the procession in a development which shall work more and more justice to all; but I do mean to say that the long continued training of a people in self-government is certain to produce a conservatism that cannot be expected in a people that are newly come to self-government and who suffer more violent reactions on that account. Not that we are perfect in the United States; not that we don't need a great many reforms. I can mention one that always comes to my mind, and that is the necessity of reform in the administration of the criminal law. But when you look back and see the progress that we have made in

many directions, I think we may congratulate ourselves in living in an age in which we are making progress, in which the people are more sensitive than they ever were before to the criticisms that we are not holding ourselves up to the right ideals. There will come undoubtedly as our country becomes more and more populated, as others press upon us, the necessity for the conservation of our resources, there will come a test of the practical operation of our system of state and national governments."

"And it will doubtless be found that at times that system does not work as well to accomplish the economies we are after as a system as the federal government has much more power, and it may be that in some directions it will be found necessary to enlarge somewhat the central power but I have an abiding faith in the Constitution of the United States as it is (applause); marvelously framed by that body of patriots and lawyers and statesmen, in simple language, bearing an elastic construction to meet conditions that they in their wildest imagination, could not have foreseen. And therefore, while in some comparatively unimportant matters we may have to change, I think the first thing to do is to keep the Constitution as it is, and to use the instrument of continuing the growth of the United States in the right direction towards our highest ideals and permit us still to maintain that system, difficult for others to understand, but which we ourselves love, that indestructible union of indestructible states."

BAKING POWDER.

Ex-Secy of War Wright Argues is Not Subject to Pure Food Law.

Washington, July 7.—Among the many knotty problems of vital interest to the housewife which the pure food and drug board of the department of agriculture has been called upon to solve, is one as to whether the effect of alum of various kinds and aluminum salts is injurious to health. At a hearing today representatives of the pickle and baking powder manufacturers, Luke E. Wright, former secretary of war, made an exhaustive argument in support of the proposition that baking powder was not subject to the provisions of the pure food and drug act. He contended that inasmuch as baking powder was not used for food, the law did not apply. The term "food" in the pure food law is restricted to those substances which are used for food, but the department always has construed this section to embrace food and substances which enter into the composition of food. The matter was taken under consideration, and a decision will be rendered later.

SENT TO PRISON.

Wife of Sig. Puccini for Causing a Girl to Commit Suicide.

Rome, July 7.—Signora Puccini, wife of Giacomo Puccini, the composer, was sentenced today to five months' imprisonment and a fine of \$120, in addition to costs and damages, the latter to be fixed by a separate court. Some months ago Signora Puccini accused her husband and a maid in her employ of having improper relations. The girl protested her innocence and subsequently committed suicide. An autopsy proved that the charges against the girl were baseless. The accusations of the wife, however, resulted in a separation, and quickly after this the mother of the girl instituted suit against Signora Puccini.

UNITED STATES NAVY HOLDS SECOND PLACE

Paris, July 7.—The Temps takes issue with M. Michel who declared yesterday in the chamber of deputies during the debate on the naval inquiry commissions report that Germany stood second among the naval powers. The Temps points out that second place is held by the United States, which with a fleet of 16 battleships "accomplished an admirable feat in the circumnavigation of the globe."

The paper adds that the English authorities class the United States second among the naval powers. Germany therefore would be third and France fourth.

ANTI-JUGGERNAUT AUTOMOBILE CLUB

Los Angeles, July 8.—Articles of incorporation of the Anti-Juggernaut Automobile club are to be filed with the county clerk and immediately steps will be taken to make the organization a factor in compelling reckless automobilists to observe those precautions necessary to safeguard lives of pedestrians.

The articles of incorporation state that the club is necessary "to the end that human beings may be afforded as much protection by law, in all seasons of the year, as is afforded by law to wild animals in closed seasons, or to wild forest trees, or to fish, and to the end that human beings may not be wanted or recklessly killed or maimed or bruised or wounded, or made to wear that hunted, timid look like a hunted deer when venturing upon the public highway."

AERONAUT FALLS A THOUSAND FEET

Chicago, July 8.—Verne Yohn, an amateur aeronaut of Chicago, fell nearly a thousand feet under his deflated balloon, a celebration at Waukegan last night. Both wrists and ankles were broken and his back was injured. At the hospital to which Yohn was taken it was said he probably would recover.

GOES TO CLAIM FORTUNE.

New York, July 8.—Mrs. Henry Burstin, of West Hoboken, N. J., is on her way to Germany to claim one-tenth of the \$10,000,000 estate left by Bishop J. Francis of Breslau, who was her uncle. She also carries the power of attorney for her brother. When the bishop died last fall, he left a will dividing his estate into 10 parts, giving one part to Mrs. Burstin and nine parts to her brother.

Recently the executors of the estate notified the American heirs to go to Germany and claim their share. As the church claims the entire estate as its own property, a contest is expected.

NARROW ESCAPE FROM DEATH ON MOUNT EDDY

Sa Francisco, July 8.—A thrilling tale of a narrow escape from death in a snowstorm on the summit of Mount Eddy in the northern part of California has been brought to this city by Capt. W. C. Holliday, who led a pleasure party up the mountain on July 4. The party left Weed, 15 miles from the summit of the mountain, early in the morning, and arrived at the summit at 10 a. m. The members were equipped with light blankets and food for three meals, as they expected to spend some time fishing in the lake which occupies the extinct crater of the mountain. At midnight it began to snow and before dawn the wind was blowing a 50-mile an hour gale. Starting at daylight, it was with the utmost difficulty that the party reached the foot of the mountain and the women members were so exhausted by cold and the walk that they had to be carried by the relief party that met them at Guerneys, 10 miles from the summit.

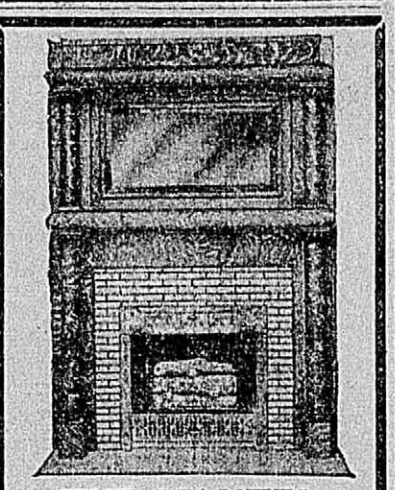
