

Here Are the Candidates Seeking Election Nov. 3.

In this article are set forth all of the tickets that will be in the field this year for the choice of voters. One ticket, the "American," is given only over its own name. Disguised as the "Taft Liberal" and the "Bryan National" the same ticket gets upon the voting machines and the ballots as well as in its natural state. In the case of the "Bryan-National," however, electors of the Democrats remain. Any person voting the "Taft-Liberal" will throw away his national vote in spite of the seductive title.

The only way to vote for Taft is to pull the Republican lever, or else, after pulling some other lever, to turn down the little levers for the Republican electors. For the straight voter, the Republican ticket is the only possible way of voting for Taft. The Democratic ticket records a vote for Bryan, and the "Bryan-National" ticket does the same thing, but adds to the total of the "American" state and Salt Lake county ticket.

The Independence party of Mr. Hendrix has only electors and a representative in Congress to vote for. The Socialist ticket is a full one for national and state officers. The full list of tickets now in the field follows:
