FORTY-SIXTH CONGRESS

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 21.—Logan reported, with an amendment, the Senate bill to place Gen. Grant on the retired list, and for its immediate consideration.

Wallace stated the nature of the amendment made by the Senate committee, which added \$71,000 to the bill.

In committee of the whole the amendments to the bill were agreed to. The bill was then reported to the Senate, with the amendments concurred in, and the bill passed.

The naval appropriation bill was received from the House and referred to the committee on appropriations.

The morning hour expired and the Indian bill came up in the regular order, but was laid aside informally. The Indian appropriation bill was taken up.

After executive session the Senate adjourned until Monday.

Summer for Arctic Use.

The *Zerova's* Washington special report says that the expedition which the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce makes in behalf of Secretary Sherman's suggestion to build a strong summer for the Arctic region, will be organized by the most interested in our "Arctic frontier." Should Congress now authorize the building of such an expedition, the expedition suggests that the ship should have sharp, rather than full lines, so that when pressed by ice she would more easily escape being tipped and crushed. She would thus be admirably adapted for the most general service, and would possibly be finished in time to carry an expedition in search of the Northwest Passage, which would be the dispatch of relief to the American Arctic explorers, north of Wrangell Land.

A LONDON DISPATCH FROM BUENOS

Ayres, dated January 20th, says: The Chileans attacked and completely defeated the Peruvian army, which was retreating in confusion. The Chileans occupied Lima, the capital, and sent reinforcements to the north. General Pizarro's brother and the Peruvian minister of war were taken prisoners. The Peruvian loss in the battle of Chacabambá is estimated to have been 7,000 killed and 2,000 prisoners. Twenty-five thousand Peruvians were engaged in the battle at Miraflores. The Chilean loss in both battles was estimated to be about 1,000. A body at Lima have urged the conclusion of an armistice, and ask that the person of Senor Pirola be respected.

A ST. PETERSBURG DISPATCH SAYS:

Two men and two women have been arrested here on suspicion of belonging to a secret society. The police discovered at their house a collection of the extreme terrorist faction of the "Black Legion," which includes revolutionary proclamations, a quantity of revolvers, daggers, axes, machinery for the manufacture of forged passports, a portion of a secret code, and a list of names of persons who are supposed to be members of the society.

CHICAGO, 21.—At 7 o'clock to-night

a fire broke out in 319 and 321 Canal Street, occupied by Mayer & Co. building. At 7 o'clock the building had been struck, causing a total loss of \$50,000. While the fire was raging at its height, the wall in the rear building toppled over, burying the entire floor of the building. The quarter. Following are the casualties: Capt. Jas. Tobin, of No. 1 engine, badly hurt internally and will probably die; Ed. Murphy, of No. 15, chest and back, will probably die; Capt. Donohue, severely; Jas. Conway, pipefitter, internally; Mike McMillen, of No. 15, head and neck; Mike Tully, plumber, slightly; John Klingler, slightly; John Quinn, shoemaker; K. Moore, slightly; Capt. M. Sullivan, severely; John J. O'Connell, head and neck; Keating, head cut; Wheeler, generally bruised. The fall of the wall was without warning, and the entire floor of the building and other fremen were beneath it and unable to escape when the tardy alarm was given them. None of the firemen escaped except those of Captains Tobin and Murphy. At 9:30 one of the trucks was thrown from his wagon and badly hurt while going toward the fire.
