The country is seamed and cut by heavy washes, leading from the table lands, along the mountains, in the direction of the Sau Ratael River. These washes are deep and rngged, often filled with heavy 101route of muddy water, that impede travel and are dangerous to cross.

Twenty-five miles south of our starting point the town of Hunting-ton is located in a fish hook like bend of Huntington Creek, the waters of which they have brought out on the town site, and quite an amount of land lying adjacent to the town the town.

A comfortable log meeting house has been erected, a store started, a saw mill in process of location, and a rood crop raised, the people, under Chas. Putsipher, seem happy and contented.

contented. After enjoying the hospitality and reating with Judge Ellas Cox for two hours, we continued our jour-bey to Castle Dale, reaching the comfortable and hospitable home of President O. G. Lareen, as the shades of night were drawing on. The conformations were all
