Correspondence.

Editor Deseret News:

Apostle Lyman and Elder John Morgan left home on the morning of Aug. 30th to visit the Saints in Emery Stake, Utah, San Luis Stake, Col., and San Juan Stake Utah.

Leaving the D & R. G. train at Castle Valley station, we were cared for by the Saints of Price River Ward, and on the following morning, in company with Brothers Rhodes and Gay, who furnished us a conveyance, we started on a forty-mile trip across the barren, verdureless hills and plateaus that lie between Green River and the mountains east of Sanpete Valley.

Very little vegetation is seen, and that little is of a stunted, dwarfed character, though the soil seems susceptible of cultivation and yields remunerative crops when properly irrigated and cared for.

The country is seamed and cut by heavy washes, leading from the table lands, along the mountains, in the direction of the San Rafael River. These washes are deep and rugged, often filled with heavy torrents of muddy water, that impede travel and are dangerous to crosses.

Twenty-five miles south of our starting point the town of Huntington is located in a fish hook like bend of Huntington Creek, the waters of which they have brought out on the town site, and quite an amount of land lying adjacent to the town.

A comfortable log meeting house has been erected, a store started, a saw mill in process of location, and a good crop raised, the people, under the guidance and care of Bishop Chas. Pulsipher, seem happy and contented.

After enjoying the hospitality and resting with Judge Elias Cox for two hours, we continued our journey to Castle Dale, reaching the comfortable and hospitable home of President O. G. Larsen, as the shades of night were drawing on.

The conference meetings were all well attended by the people and everything connected with the welfare of the saints, reported in a fairly prosperous condition; in addition to the conference meetings, meetings were held in Orangeville, Huntington and Price Wards.

On returning to Castle Valley station, we were joined by Pres. A. O. Smoot and together continued our journey to Denver, having also the company of six Elders en-route to the Southern States Mission, with whom we parted at Pueblo.

It is scarcely worth while to undertake a description of the marvelous feats of engineering accomplished in getting the D. & R. G. R. established, through these mountain fastnesses, it is simply beyond description.

The mighty gorges penetrated, the dizzy heights climbed, the roaring torrents crossed, the grand scenery, all combine to make it a heavier task than can be accomplished in one short epistle.

Denver in the bright sunlight of a cloudless morning, washed clean and refreshed by a copious shower the day previous, looked pleasant and cheering.

A visit to the Mineral Exposition, a ride through its thoroughfares, a few prominent points visited and we take the cars for Colorado Springs and Manitou, the last named point reached at 6 p.m. We drove to Rainbow Falls, Ute Pass, and drink from the soda spring.

After supper we took a moonlight drive through the Garden of the Gods, and had the principal points of interest pointed out, by an enterprising John, who seemed well posted, but who threw a cloud over his veracity at the very start by informing President Smoot that Johnson's army on their way to Utah in '57 passed over that identical spot.

One happy incident of our visit to Manitou, was meeting Gen. Doniphan, whom many of the Saints will readily remember. He shows the imprint of age, being 75 years old, about six feet four tall, and a firm friend to the Latter-day Saints. An hour's stay at Colorado Springs,

and we take the Durango Express for San Luis Valley, passing Pueblo in the night, and reaching La Veta Pass as the tall dome-like tops of the Spanish Peaks are gilded by the light of the rising sun. A white frost covers the ground at the summit, 9,337 feet above the sea level. The tenderer leaves show indication of chilly winter, and the mountain sides are variegated and beautiful in their many tinted hues.

The Grand Valley of San Luis looks pleasant and cheering, and soon we are in sight of the homes of the Saints who there reside. Prest. B. S. Smith and a few friends meet us at the railroad, and we are presently greeting friends in the thriving town of Manassa.

Our little town is closely quarantined, and we trust that through the blessing of the Lord and our vigilance it will not be inflicted upon us. One case came here but did not spread. Our little colony enjoy peace, good-fellowship and reasonable prosperity, with general good health.
