REMARKABLE VOYAGE OF SCHOONER SILVER WAVE

Port Townsend, Wash., Nov. 18.—With the aid of no other navigating instruments than a single compass and a chart made in 1808, and worn by years of service and lacking in accurate information as to the location of the coast, the little two-masted trading schooner Silver Wave yesterday completed a voyage unparalleled in the history of Pacific shipping. The schooner arrived here from Nome after 22 days of buffeting gales that would have taxed the strongest vessel. The schooner sailed at a dangerous season and made the 2,500-mile journey with only one member of the crew of five, an experienced sailor in spite of all difficulties and was picked up at Cape Flattery within a few miles of what would have been a probable course of a vessel fully equipped for the voyage.
