

EDUCATIONAL MATTERS.

A Review of the General Assembly of the Report of the Committee of Ten, by Superintendent Miller, and by English by Professor Marshall, and of Geography by Mr. A. E. Brotherton.

At the annual meeting of the National Educational Association, held in Chicago last year, a committee consisting of ten members of prominent standing in the field of education was chosen to select the subjects and arrange the program of a series of conferences on the principal subjects that came into the center of study of the secondary schools of the United States. The work of each conference was to be reported to a single subject of study and was to include an inquiry into the best methods of teaching it. The subject of the first conference was English, and the second, Geography.

The committee on English, in its report, recommended that the study of English be made the central subject of the secondary school, and that it be taught in such a way as to develop the student's ability to express himself in clear, logical, and effective language. It also recommended that the study of English be made a part of the daily routine of the school, and that it be taught by a teacher who is qualified to do so.

The committee on Geography, in its report, recommended that the study of Geography be made a part of the daily routine of the school, and that it be taught in such a way as to develop the student's ability to understand the world around him. It also recommended that the study of Geography be made a part of the daily routine of the school, and that it be taught by a teacher who is qualified to do so.

Without exception the conference members agreed that the study of English and Geography should be made a part of the daily routine of the school, and that it be taught in such a way as to develop the student's ability to express himself in clear, logical, and effective language.

One of the first and most important recommendations of the committee on English was that the study of English be made the central subject of the secondary school. This recommendation was based on the fact that English is the language of the school, and that it is the language of the world. It is the language of the future, and it is the language of the present.

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Through its study of the National Educational Association, the committee on English and Geography has been able to gain a better understanding of the needs of the secondary schools of the United States. It has been able to see that the study of English and Geography should be made a part of the daily routine of the school, and that it be taught in such a way as to develop the student's ability to express himself in clear, logical, and effective language.

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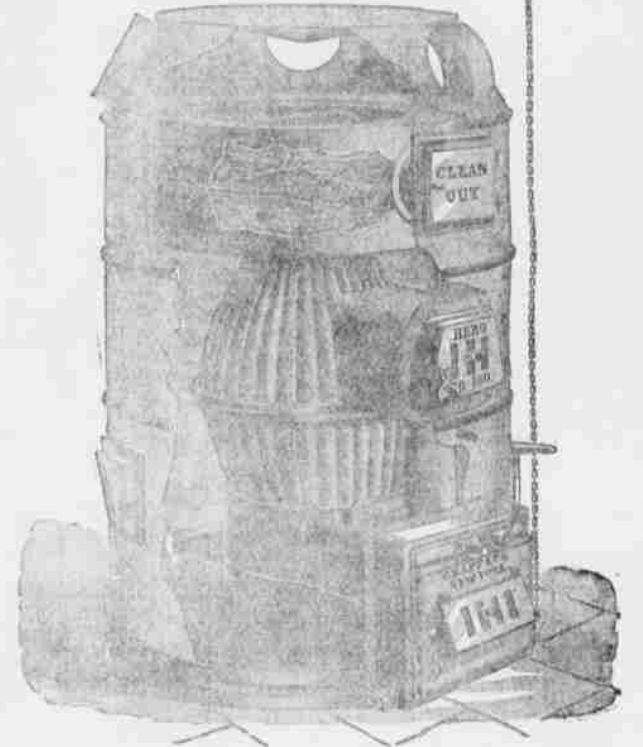
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
