Manassa, Col., March 2d, 1881.

Editor Deseret News:

Our people here are moving along quietly, planing and preparing for the future, as best they can. An agreement has been entered into to fence in our farming land, for the protection of our grain from the ravages of stock. It has been thought that the law-making power of this State will repeal the stock, or no fence law, and whether they will or not, it will be well to put a good and substantial fence around our contemplated crop, and not suffer ourselves to be annoyed as we were last year. Many times during the past year there were at night, often from five to perhaps 50 head of stock on our growing wheat, oats, etc. And this continued nearly, if not quite every night night, till the grain i was f harvested, hauled in and stacked. The wonder is that we saved as much as we did. We we saved as much as we did. We aim to sence in, here at Manassa, 960 acres in one field, which is a section and a half, and hence two


