

SENIOR SENATOR SUCCEMBS

John S. Morrill of Vermont Dies Calmly and Peacefully This Morning.

Will be seen No More in Congress. Where He Has Been for Forty-Two Years.

Washington, Dec. 28.—Hon. Justin Smith Morrill, the senior United States senator from Vermont, died at twenty minutes past 1 o'clock this Wednesday morning, in the 84th year of his age, after an illness of less than a week. With him, when the end came, were his sister-in-law, Miss Louise Davis, his son, James, Mr. Benjamin Davis, for a long time associated with the senator in finance committee, and his nephew, Mr. J. B. Chamberlain, an intimate friend.

Senator Morrill was in the house at the time he was taken ill, and after a few days' illness, he was removed to the Vermont hospital, where he died. The senator never recovered from the pneumonia attack into which he fell early in the day. His death was calm and peaceful. The immediate cause of death was pneumonia, which developed from an attack of grippe contracted about a week ago. He had been in bed for several days.
