NET AND GOVERNORS.

Tho B & O Red Book has become the standard text book on elections, est livers having turned gray in vor. That it is deserved as evinced early life, - Chloago Herald. by the unflagging enterprise mani eated n its preparation and publication. The latest exhibition of a determination to meet even the most exacting demand is the issuing of the Ohio alection less than a month following the election in that State, Ordinarily these who are proce to studying the official flaures of a pol itical contest have to wait months before receiving them in compre heasive form, and then do all the figuring themselves. Here is the B. & O. Red Book for Onio, not only with the election results in every county tabulated in the cleares manner, but comparison with pass results are all figured out and explanatory remarks which are of the greatest interest. As a specimen edition of the Red Book the contents are worthy of note. The Presiden tial vote by countles in 1876 and 1880, with majorities, losees and gains, total vote, etc., whi e the side notes give a summary of all the Presidential elections in the State since it admittance into the Union. The Congressional vote of 1878 and 1890, by counties and districts, with full details of the changes made by the new reappointment. The Gubernatorial vote of 1883 compared with that of Secretary of State, 1832, msjoritles, gains, etc., and side notes covering all possible data as regards results. Comparative table, showing demogratic vote for Governor, for 1877 to 1883, showing gains and an interesting study of the democratic vote as compared with the vote for the prohibition amendment. A similar comparable table based upon the republican vote for Governor for the same year

and comparison of the vote for the prohibition amendment with the republican vote for Governor, 1883. Another most interesting table is that devoted to a comparison of the v te of both parties and the total vote each year from 1880 to 1883, incinsive; this by counties and showing great care in computation. Full roster o the United States Senate, 48th Congress, and full roster of the House of Representatives, 43th Congress, arranged so that compari-son can be made with the full roster of the 47.h Congress. List of Governors of States, expiration of term, Louis, Cmaha, London, and princi- date of next election in each State, and of meeting of Legislature.

Certainly a very eleverly construced book to contain all this, and it is by no means a large one either. Very handy as to size, teautifully print-d upon fine paper and a hand-some cover, the Red Book as char-acteristic of all the B. &. O. publications, is exceedingly artistic and attractive.

Of course it is an advertisement elee it would not be sent free upon application by letter or postal to C. K. Lord, Baltimore, but so unobtrusive is the advertising matter. and so valuable the mass of infor mation the book contains, that it would undoubtedly reli like hot cakes if put upon the market. However, there is no desire manifested to sell it; all who wish, get the Red Book by return mail even with the pustage paid upon it. The remark-ably complete make up, and perfect unbiased presentation of the reolts in Ohio may be token as con-clusive that the Red Book for the coming presidential year, will in its different editions, be in great demand It is understood that several new features in connection with the information which will be so carnestly sought after next year, are already in course of preparation, and those who are down on the mailing lists of the B. & O, will certainly receive books worth keeping

The policy of the B & O. is torender its advertising matter so valuable from the information to which the largest portion of space is given, that the demand for it will much more than compensate for the largely in creased expense in the preparation and publication. Large sums bave been offered by outside concerns for advertizing space in the Red Book, out no money can buy it. I he pub lication is teyond question the finest and most effective is ued by any railroad company, and the B. & O has uo notion of decreasing its value. Hardly a newspaper office in the country that does not keep the dif-ferent collions of the Red Book always on hand for r ference, while to State Committees and other political organizations it has become in-

dispensible. Praise has unstintedly been bestowed upon it by President and candidates for the presidency, Cab net officers, Governors and other high dignitaries, and it is in-deed the popular political text-book of the day.


