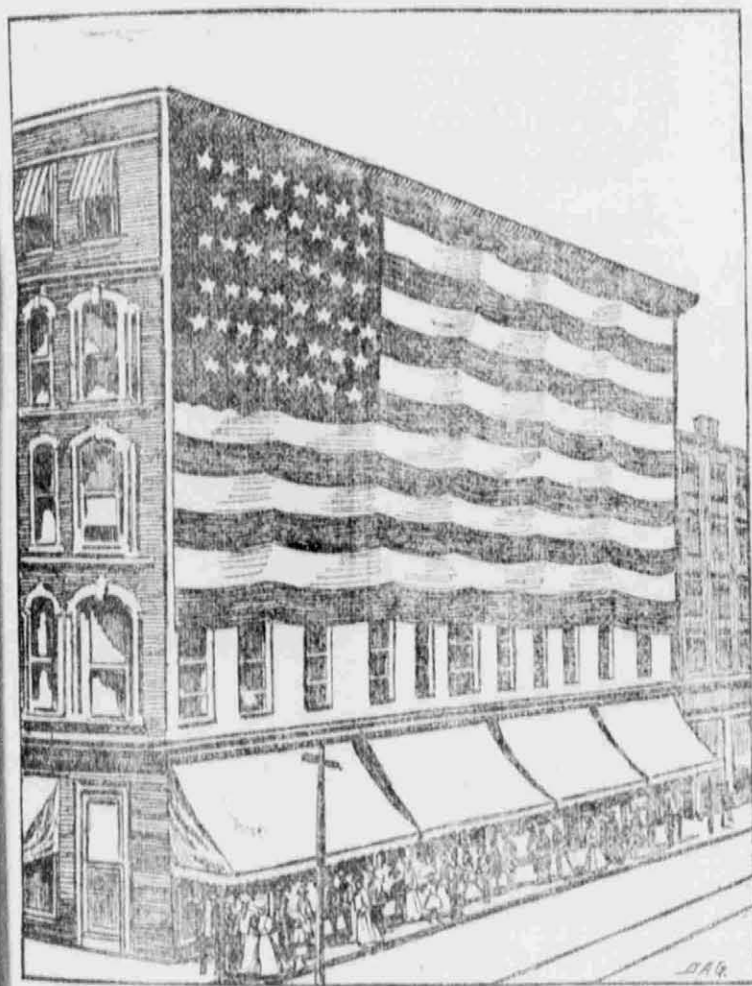




C. M. SCHWAB RETURNS.

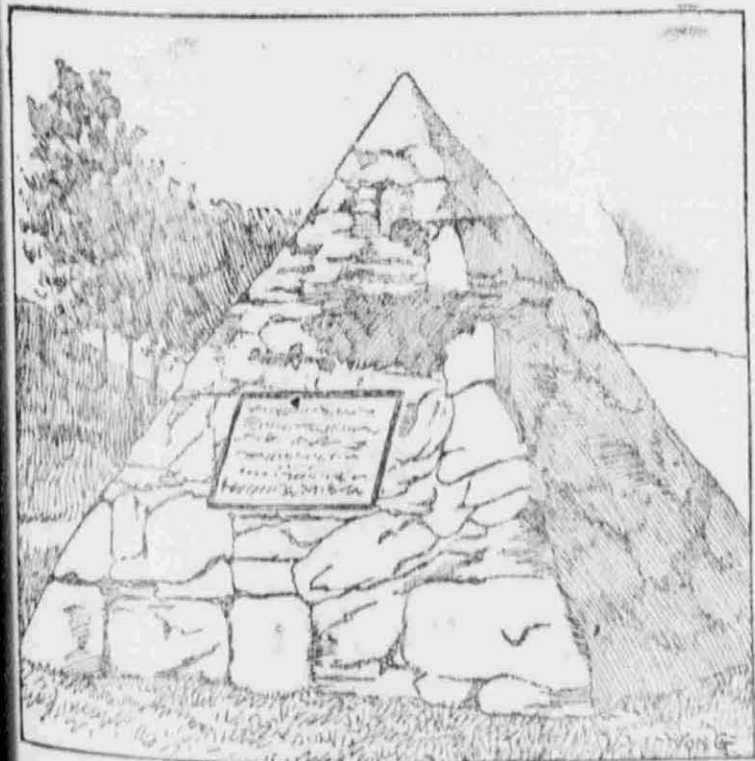
Charles M. Schwab, who heads the steel industry of this country, has returned from Germany. It is rumored that all differences between Mr. Carnegie and Mr. Schwab in regard to \$25,000,000 worth of work on the Russian navy contract have been settled. When Mr. Schwab was seen at his office he had more or less to say in denial of various stories that had been set afloat, and also claimed that his trip to Europe was more for recreation and rest than anything else. Mr. Schwab did not see Mr. Carnegie on his trip to Europe.

LARGEST AMERICAN FLAG IN EXISTENCE.



The largest American flag in the world, herewith illustrated, was recently exhibited for the first time in Denver, Colo. It was designed as an ornament for the building used for Grand Army encampments and other great meetings, and it covers almost the entire front of the huge structure. It is 115 feet in length, 45 feet in width, and has stars two feet across. The stripes are 4 feet 2 inches in width, and there are 1,450 yards of bunting in the flag. The intention at first was to have the flag float from a staff in front of the building, but no pole of sufficient strength could be obtained, the bunting weighing 450 pounds.

A MEMORIAL TO THE DISCOVERY OF ORE.



The pyramidal structure shown in the cut was constructed near Negaunee, Mich., on the spot where once stood the famous Jackson stump, beneath which was discovered the first ore ever seen in Michigan. The memorial is twelve feet in height and ten feet wide at the base. It is built of large blocks of granite, and is a fitting monument to the discovery of ore in Michigan. On the side facing the road there is placed a large iron plate, on which are engraved particulars concerning the history of the discovery. As a specimen of high art the pyramid is not conspicuous, but it serves admirably to commemorate a very important event in the history of Michigan.
