PICTORIAL HOME BIBLE.—Mr. Parker, who is engaged in selling to subscribers in this western country the Pictorial Home Bible, called upon us yesterday, and showed us the kind of Bible he is selling. Of course it is King James' translation, and in speaking of "the kind of Bible," we refer to its particular features aside from the text. It contains the Apocrypha and Marginal References, and, in addition to these, has a Concordance. The great feature, however, of this edition of the Book is what are called the Companion articles. These are illustrative, explanatory and devotional, being drawn from the best authorities, and are not written in the interest of any one sect. There are over 300 illustrations engraved on steel, and colored in colors. A chronological index of the Bible, a key to antiquities words of the Scripture and other special features add greatly to the value of this edition. The editor has apparently done all in his power to include everything that will aid the Bible student and add to the value of the work as a Book of reference in families.

BUILDINGS.—Several new buildings are about to be erected on the Greenbook Corner, Second South Street, the old structures having been lately torn down, and the material for building new ones is being rapidly laid on the ground.

Mr. Jarnan is having several two-story edifices built on the same block, a little to the eastward.

A HARD TIME OF IT.—It is now nearly six months since Brother Joseph Schofield was injured by falling from a building in the 19th Ward. It was thought at the time that his injuries were not very severe, but the fact that he has never been able to resume work to the present time shows that his frame must have received a very severe shock by the accident. We are pleased to say that, although very weak, he is gradually gaining strength, but his progress is so slow he is to be almost imperceptible. One of the results of the injuries he received is the depression of one of his shoulders, nearly an inch below the level of the other.

WANTS TO CONTINUE.—The individual by whom the drinking saloon was opened in the fifteenth Ward, and against the continuance of which a remonstrance of citizens in that vicinity was presented to the City Council on Tuesday evening, has been conducting the establishment without paying license. Since the presentation of the petition, however, he has obtained the signatures of some citizens to an application for license, which he has presented to the city authorities. We believe it is very doubtful if the license shall be granted, as the law requires that an application for liquor license shall have the signatures of a majority of the tax-paying residents of the block on which the applicant desires to establish his saloon, after which it must be ratified or sanctioned by the Aldermen of the municipal Ward in which the establishment is to be situated. After these preliminaries are attended to, the application is to be presented to the Mayor and City Council.

NEW SLAUGHTER HOUSE.—Mr. H. J. Faust has built a large slaughter house in the vicinity of the Warm Springs, on the ground designated for the building of such places by the City Council. We understand that Mr. Faust will do the slaughtering for the butchers of the city. This will doubtless be more profitable to the latter than cost going to the expense of putting a separate building up for himself.

SOMEthing NEW IN BEE-KEEPING.—Bee culture is one of the growing interests of this country, and every year is receiving increased attention and care. In almost every locality favorable to the industry a little honey producer. This is owing, for the most part, to improved hives, and other useful mechanical devices which, skillfully used, make the business profitable. During the last year or two, owing to the efforts of a few earnest apiculturists, it has received a new impulse in Utah, and promises, before long, to become lucrative.

As usual, among experimentalists, with but little experience, many of the keepers of Utah are, there are conflicting opinions and theories respecting various points of bee culture, which experience only will finally settle. In the News of yesterday appeared the correspondence, from Mr. Henry A. Norton, denouncing

the large podded milkweed, as sure destruction to the honey bee, and an idea somewhat similar to that put forth recently by correspondents of the Evening News, namely, the Oregon Junction. The latter gentleman declared, we believe, that the entire loss of the bees was due to this weed caused almost instant death. Mr. Norton's idea of death to the bee is equally certain, but the modes operandi are different. He says that when the bees alight on the leaf they stick to it, and die, or if they regain their freedom they take a small scale of some kind from the leaf sticking to their feet, and in working to rid themselves of this scale, "they pull their feet off," so that in either case contact with the milkweed causes the death of the bee. In this way Mr. Norton accounts for the fact that bees unable to fly or walk are often found along by their more fortunate companions.

Mr. Seth Putnam, of this city, and Mr. John Morgan, of Mill Creek, acknowledged to be two of the most enterprising and experienced bee-keepers in the territory, read Mr. Norton's communication in yesterday's News, and this morning they called at the office of the Evening News to make known to the apiculturists of the territory, through our columns, some of their experience about milkweed and crippled bees. In the first place, they advised the bee-keepers not to destroy the milkweed, stating positively that it is one of the best honey plants the Territory produces, and that the bees about the milkweed, perhaps, open up a new phase in bee culture. They brought a few young bees with them this morning, that had never been out of the hive until taken out by them, every one of which was in the condition mentioned by Mr. Norton—minus one or two legs, or rather the lower part of the legs nearly every leg thus "scotched" was attacked by a substance, about the thirty-second of an inch in length, resembling the color of beeswax. Some of the bees the same formation was attached to what they called the protectors of the honey tubes, under the throat. Both gentlemen stated that last July, and since the commencement of the present month, they had observed a very large number of young bees thus mutilated or deformed, before ever leaving the hive, and that they have sometimes seen as many as a thousand carried by the healthy bees from one hive in a day. They are positive that milkweed has nothing whatever to do with this condition, but are satisfied it is a disease that is likely to prove destructive, making it, as they concluded, The bees brought here this morning were examined under a microscope, but with good eyesight and close looking at, the foreign substance, whatever it may be, can be easily seen attached to the end of the mutilated leg. Territorial bee keepers will do well to give some attention to this curious malformation or mutilation of their young bees. Probably their united observations, if made known, may throw light on the disease, which may lead to its prevention hereafter.

Mr. Putnam says that in all his experience in bee keeping, in other parts of the country, he never saw anything like this before, and he intends to immediately send specimens of the mutilated bees to some of the best apiculturists in the States in hopes that useful information may be elicited.
