PICTORIAL HOME BIBLE,-Mr. Parker. who is engaged in selling to subscribers in this western country the Pictorial Home Bible, called upon us yesterday, and showed us the kind of Bible he is selling. Of course it is King James' translation, and in speaking of "the kind of Bible," we refer to its particular features aside from the text. It contains the Apochryphs and Marginal References, and, in addition to these, has a Concordance. The great fea-ture, however, of this edition of the Book is what are called the Companion articles.
