Secretary Windom said to-day he had no reason why Assistant Secretary Upton should resign, or he should request his resignation.

Opilus French, commissioner of roads, has returned and received charge of his office in the Department. He says he is going to California on his annual inspection and examination of the Pacific railroad matter, and there is consequently no occasion for a special report to the Secretary of the Interior concerning it, in place of his regular annual report.

He also says he will report to make to the Attorney General concerning the Government suit now pending against the Central Pacific Railroad Company in New York, as that matter was several months ago referred to Dis- Attorney Woodford, with whom he placed himself in communication while in California, and who intends to see in New York to- day. He will also, while in California, make a further examination of the accounts of the Central Pacific Co., and is assured it will be paid into the hands of the United States treasury whatever he finds to be due from it to the government under the require- ments of the Thurman funding law. Few of this understanding and satisfactory result of his investi- gation in California he has no doubt pending suit will be discontinued.

French says his fear that the interests of the government were in danger from leases, etc., made by the Central Pacific Co., was removed by the discovering that the reports furnished him on the subjects had been obscure, im- perfect and erroneous, and his letter to the President stating this con- clusion was written to him in com- munication with the request made by the latter while they were still en- gaged in examining in California, with the explanation that it was forwarded to him from the Secretary's office to Europe by mail.

Commissioner French also remarks that he has not yielded any part of his position on the part of the govern- ment against the company, but on the contrary, they will be full, according to his official statement and computations.

Assistant Attorney General, Mc- Donnell, law officer of the Interior Department, will leave Washington tomorrow for Fort Hall, Indian reser- vation, to arrange for a council and settlement between the Indians and representatives of the Union Pacific Railway Company, in regard to the right of way through their reservation for the projected branch to Oregon.

The House this evening went into committee on the land bill. Healey's amendment to the third clause, do- ing away with the distinction be- tween present and future tenancies, was rejected, 301 to 59. E. Dwyer Gray's amendment, that the Gov- ernment should extend the benefits of the bill to tenants who were in arrears of rent through no fault of their own, was withdrawn, and clause 3 passed without division.

In the French Chamber of Deputies, the Minister of the Interior, re- sponding to a question, said fighting in Marseilles began by a number of Italian laborers attacking a party of French workmen. This caused re- prisals, and in the ensuing series of affrays, four persons were killed and 17 wounded. He added, every pre- caution had been taken to preserve peace. The *Journal Des Debats* ad- mits that the Italians were first to foment the quarrel by hissing, but remarks that did not justify the acts of the municipality or the excesses of Saturday.
