'He found five girls and three boys, who came in charge of the Elders. They were detained, and three families were sent to join them in the landing bureau enclosure"

The New York Telegram in a vile article approving of the return of the children, admitted that "most of these new Mormons were in families." _ And one of the families which were detained was composed as follows according to the N. Y. World:

"There was a Swiss, Nicholas Egil, with a family of five. He is hoary and wrinkled and is fifty-five years old. He says he has been a Mormon for twenty-three years. His wife is as pid as he. One son, twenty-nine years old, is an imbecile, not larger than a teu-year-old boy. They were bound for Idaho, where they have relatives, but they will probably be returned to Swit zeriand."
