## SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 9 -A number of bills were introduced, among them a bill raising the salaries of bureau officers in the Executive Department at Wash-ington, also a bill to incorporate a European and American Land and Emi-gration Company. The bill hames a dozen incorporators from as many States, and empowers the company to buy, sell, and hold real estate, provided that it shall not own more than one million acres at any one time; to make and enforce contracts for the emigration of foreigners and their transpertation

to the United States; also to have power to lend money on bond or mortgage on real estate situated in the United States, or upon hypothecation of real estate, mortgages for any period or credit, re-payable by way of annulties or other-wise; to issue bonds to the extent of the value of its assets and to receive money or securities on deposit at legal rates of interest.

Several bills passed, including a bill to authorize deputy collectors of dustoms to act as disbursing agents in certain cases; a bill to repeal certain provisions of the law relating to advancement in the navy; the House bill to amend the act to establish a Department of Justice; and the House bill to prevent certain officers of the United States from prac-
