Salt, Bernardino, Cal., Nov. 18.—The westbound Overland passenger train was held up by four robbers about six o'clock this morning between Daguerre and Fresno.

Degree Manager Hutchinson drove them off with Buckshot and the train pulled out for Los Angeles. At Hartsfield the trainmen went a piece back to the scene of the bombing, where the body of one of the victims was found yesterday.

... The engineer stopped the train and proceeded in attempting to the cause. Fred Hinkley, a helper, who also was on the train at Daguerre, stood at the two windows and then jumped from the engine. The train was then taken

The body was taken to Harrow; it is unidentified.

He said that the ship yards of John H. Harlin at West New Brighton, N. I., today burned seven buildings and their contents, and said damage estimated to be about \$400,000. The buildings destroyed were of brick. Three were big structures, the four there above

There are 22 stores in the property.
