PAY YOUR POLL TAX.

Notice to delinguents: All persons wing poll tax for the year 1887 are hereby notified that unless the same be paid on or before the 10th day of De cember, 1887, at Office No 8, City Hall, action will be commenced against them for the collection of the tax and costs of suit, as provided by law. Following is the section of City ordinance relating to the subject: "Section 5 .- If any person shall fail

to pay the tax required by this ordin-ance (to wit: two days' work of eight hours each, or in lieu thereof three dollars lawful money), within ten days after the time mentioned in the notice provided for in the preceding section, said tax shall be deemed delinquent, and the person so liable shall there after be required to pay such tax in money; and the Supervisor of Streets, as such, must proceed to collect the same as an action of debt in any court having jurisdiction, and no property of such delinquent shall be exempt from execution on a judgment so recovered '
