"Can any good thing come out of Nazareth, is a saying that applies to a large class, as to the views entertained of the "Mormons" by those who compose it.

STILL THEY COME. -Our streets for several days past have been thronged with country cousins, hailing from the north, south, east and west. The trains on the Utah Central come in loaded to the guards with visitors, and the State road south of the city for the past two days has present-ed one continual string of teams, freighted with dusty but cheerful looking passen-gers; all coming in to attend the Semi-Annual Conference. The attendance at the Tabernacle promises to be large, as usual.
