



## DOUBLE-HEADER; TEAMS BROKE EVEN

Spokane Fans Saw Two Good Games Between Salt Lake and Indians Yesterday.

JIM WIGGS WON, KOSTAL LOST.

Local Ball Tossers Braced Up and Played Snappy Game—Buck Weaver's Great Fielding.

The addition of Buck Weaver to the Salt Lake baseball team seems to have gingered the boys up some as they fought the Indians to a standstill at Spokane yesterday. The teams played a double header, Jim Wiggs winning his game and Kostal losing his fight. But both games were snappy and interesting, and the 2,500 fans present saw good exhibitions of the national game. The first game was won by Salt Lake by a score of eight to three, the second went to the Indians by a score of six to five. The pleasing features of the games was the fielding of Buck Weaver, Donahue, Flannery and Davis. Several times these men set the fans to howling with delight by their stopping of what seemed must be sure hits. Weaver took chances on two that looked impossible but he made them and was warmly applauded. Wiggs pitched the first game and was given splendid support. He had perfect control and struck out men almost as he pleased. The second game looked good to Salt Lake. In the fifth inning they made three runs by hits from Kostal, Davis, Hanley and Weed. From that time, however, Hodge held the Salt Lakers down and Spokane finally got in the winning run. The summary of both games follows:
