

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

Matters in Arrest Cleared Off by the County Selection.

The county court was in session yesterday afternoon and sat through the following business:

The claim of Casper Taylor (\$54) for services at the request over the remains of Joseph W. Leonard, was disallowed on the recommendation of the county attorney. The original bill was \$76, but the coroner deducted the sum of \$25, which Leonard had on his person at the time of his death.

The claims of J. H. Newman in the sum of \$120 and H. Dinsmore of \$100, for documents on county warrants, were allowed.

The claim of F. E. McArthur, in the sum of \$150, was referred to the county attorney.

The claims of D. B. Allen, \$22,000; E. M. Collins, \$10, and J. R. Tarrance, \$50, were approved.

The claim of A. K. Hardy, in the sum of \$150, was laid over.

The claim of H. N. Bassett, in the sum of \$100, for payment and interest on account of the joint city and county building, was referred to the Selectmen.

The work was instructed to notify certain road supervisors to use only three percent object to pull tax for working on the roads.

W. F. Still said that no award was put over the door of the county office to the Selectmen to determine who did the work.

Appropriations were made amounting to the aggregate of \$11,497. An adjourned till Monday next.

Their Terms Nearly Expired.

HYPNOTISM.

A Lecture and Experiments by Professor Henry.

A small but critical audience greeted Professor Henry last night in the old court room, where he delivered his initial lecture on hypnotism. The professor traced the mysterious science back to its origin in antiquity. The ancient magi, he said, were acquainted with it, and the Egyptians are known to have effected healings by imposition of hands. The Greeks derived their knowledge chiefly from the Egyptians and learned the power of the touch of a hand, among other things. The science has been known by different names, but it is the same thing. Henry appears to have been the first to systematize the science. He believed that the plants exerted an influence over human beings, and also that there is in the atmosphere a peculiar fluid that can be controlled by man. Having studied the various powers of magnetism, he was led to adopt the opinion that this a natural fluid is similar to the fluid of the human magnetism. He submitted numerous demonstration before his discovery was recognized. A commission appointed to investigate his system first denied him, after further investigation took place, and another commission that lasted for six years accepted him. Now however, numerous and the name of the discoverer extended over the world. Dr. Henry is Masterman, Dr. Henry, who has written a book on the disease, looking closely at an aspect when they wanted to come into a state of trance, upon Mesmer's theory. The old idea of a fluid was somewhat forgotten and Henry took the lead. The science was now settled.

HYPNOTISM.

A new school was opened which traces the presentation to the name of the ancient word upon "hypnotism." The speaker had studied with these theories and was satisfied that there was truth in them. He offered a practical application of his theories, and the hypnotic state can be produced on healthy persons while others maintain that only weak or unhealthy subjects could be successfully hypnotized. In fact, the persons who are most prone to success are the weak. As to the other there should be no doubt. A host of weak, young, slender, nervous, meek, gentle, timid, etc., persons are a ready prey to the hypnotist.
