**Last Night's Dispatches.**

**EASTERN.**  
Why He Was Arrested.  
NEW YORK, 15.—A Berlin special  
says that a St. Petersburg telegram  
leads to the inference that the  
Grand Duke Nicholas was arrested  
in consequence of the appearance  
and of certain diamonds.

**The Currency Bill.**  
CHICAGO, 15.—A Washington  
special says that a member of the  
House banking committee says the  
currency bill, as passed in the Sen-  
ate last night, will come up and  
pass the House to-morrow, without  
debate or amendment, and it is  
thought will be signed by the Pres-  
ident.

**Rejoicing at Little Rock.**  
LITTLE ROCK, 15.—The preceding  
officers of both Houses, to-day, re-  
ceived the President's proclamation  
recognizing Baxter as Governor  
of Arkansas. Many people thronged  
Baxter's quarters to congratulate  
him during the day, and great re-  
joicing was witnessed in the city. Ex-  
actly to-day, issued general orders  
complementing his soldiers for their  
bravery, and commending their  
promptitude in answering his calls.

**A Supplemental Opinion.**  
AT WASHINGTON, 15.—The At-  
torney-General, in a supplemental  
opinion, reviews the decision of the  
supreme court of Arkansas in the  
case of the application of Brooks for  
a writ of habeas corpus, and the  
State Treasurer, to pay a warrant  
drawn in Brooks' favor, as Govern-  
or, and which reached the At-  
torney-General after the rest of his  
opinion was written. The At-  
torney-General thinks that the fact  
that Brooks' application to the  
President for aid to suppress the  
insurrection, which was dated  
April 20th, and was signed by three  
of the judges of the supreme court  
who had rendered the decision, and  
by Page, stating that they recog-  
nized Brooks as the Governor, is a  
sufficient indication of its value. The  
supreme court of the United States  
will not hear a case thus  
made up and argued, and a decision  
thus obtained is not recognized by  
any respectable tribunal; and while  
it will add to the complications of  
the situation it will not affect  
Baxter's right to the office of Gov-  
ernor.

**FOREIGN.**  
**PRUSSIA.**  
A Royal Scamp.  
BERLIN, 15.—It appears from St.  
Petersburg advices, that it was  
Prince Nicholas, nephew of the  
Emperor, who was arrested. He  
has, his brother, who was recently  
arrested there; the young man, it  
seems, gave his mother's diamonds  
as a pledge to the police, and was  
arrested on the ground that he was  
interfering in the course of the law.
