Carbon is already known in the forms of diamond, graphite, and lampblack, or charcoal. The fear of death, we are assured is waning. Those who have witnessed the "death-agony" in many and var-ied forms tell us that it is not so terrible after all, and even that dying is not at all painful. C. W. Saleeby, an English writer, points out that in all but very exceptional cases, such as accident, the immediate cause of death is the poisoning of the nervous centers by carbonic acid. 
