

# SLAVE TRADE AMONG BRITISH COLUMBIA INDIANS

Vancouver, B. C., Jan. 5.—The following is an extract from a report made to the government regarding the slave trade among the British Columbia Indians, the report being signed by C. J. South, superintendent of the Children's Aid society:

"At Cape Mudge there is a family of half-breeds, both men and girls show-

ing very little of the Indian in them, and the elder brother, being very ambitious and as unprincipled as he is, has given a pollack, spending some thousands of dollars, and it is reported to me that the principal portion of his money has been made by the sale of girls, and from this source he has become powerful and rich.

"Girls with white skins, thick brown hair braided down their backs, big innocent, childish eyes, are being sold today, and have been sold for years, in British Columbia to the highest bidder.

The slave masters are the Cape Mudge Indians. The slaves are white because their grandmothers were sold before to white men, and when their grandmothers wandered back to the tribe, deserted and abandoned, they brought baby girls with them, and in course of time the male relatives of these abandoned creatures, sold those baby girls too, when they grew up to young girlhood.

"The men thus born are left to shift for themselves, but there have grown up slave dealers in Cape Mudge who

have become rich and powerful by the barter in quarter, eighth and sixteenth breed girls. They have created a market which is constantly growing and the demand has become so great that other markets have been sought, and it is reported that Rock Bay Indians are embarking in this awful industry."
