### EXAMINUS FOR COMPROMISE.

Council Committee and Legal Repre-  
sentatives of Gold Company  
Met and Agreed.

Last night the Council committee on municipal laws with the representatives of the coal companies, drawing water from the Utah River, unanimously voted to accept the compromise offered by the owners of property in the east shore of the river. A bill of compromise was passed by the Council that the bill now pending of the above two property owners against the city and other corporations would stand in a while and take effect when the city would be present.

Franklin B. Richards and Judge Patterson, representing the coal companies, were in favor of accepting the compromise, and Mr. Nichols argued the case on behalf of the city. He said that if the city were present, the referee would裁决 in favor of the property owners, so they have done in the past, and the city would be compelled to pay more than it had agreed to, so the referee would not be bound to accept the compromise, and try so do all it can to the present time without being called.

City Attorney Hays admitted that the referee would be bound to accept the compromise, because it was for the welfare of the city, but he thought that at some time before the city would be the winner in the suit.

The discussion on this subject will probably continue until the first day of August. The city council referred the decision of the referee granting the plan of 1870 to the voters, but a bill is pending at present.

The election will be held Saturday evening to favor of the compromise, upon the motion of Mr. Miller.

The physician who operated was Dr. Smith, who it was found that he was in a very critical condition, the physician stating that death would have ensued in a short time had not the operation been performed. ### MILITARY MATTERS.

**Election to Fill Vacancy Held by Troop C last Night—First Ballot Voted.**

Troop C, First Cavalry, National Guard of Utah, held an election at the Infantry House building last night for the purpose of filling the vacancy caused by the promotion of its first lieutenant, J. A. Smith, to a major's rank. The election was conducted by Captain Naylor, under the direction of Major Smith and resulted in Second Lieutenant Weston being made first lieutenant and Sergeant Frost, second. Captain Naylor will in the near future assume one of his duties at present to fill the vacancy caused by the pro-

motion of Sergeant Frost to a lieutenancy.

The following order was then issued last night:

"The First Cavalry will report at Fair Grounds on Friday morning at 9 a. m. to receive orders. At 12 noon, at the same hour, the Adjutant General will issue orders to the various units of the company, which ever may be needed for the execution of the order.

The people of this city seem to be a little extravagant in their use of city water, as the waterworks department is beginning to complain and say that unnecessary waste is being made of good money, a serious consideration of the inhabitants will become necessary.

**August Weather.**

The following data, compiled from the weather bureau records at Salt Lake City, Utah, cover the month of August for 21 years, and should prove of value and interest in anticipating the more important meteorological elements, and the range within which such variations may be expected for the coming month of August.

Temperature—Mean of normal summer month is 62°; average daily maximum month was that of 1875, with an average of 78° degrees; the coldest month was that of 1884, with an average of 57° degrees; the highest temperature was 108° degrees, on August 13, 1873; the lowest temperature was 41° degrees, on August 16, 1875.

Precipitation—Rain and melted snow—Average for the month is 0.75 inches per square mile; the highest monthly precipitation was 1.04 inches in 1881; the least monthly precipitation was 0.05 inches in 1892; the greatest amount of precipitation received in any 24 consecutive hours was 1.12 inches on August 11, 1875.

Globe—Number of days of 60° or more in degree number of clear days, 17; partly cloudy days, 3; cloudy days, 2.

**Wine.**—The prevailing wine have been from the following: the highest quality, French; with California being the next, followed by Australia, the next, Italy, and Germany.
