NEW ORLEANS, 28.—C. L. Patterson, republican member of the Louisiana legislature from Natchitoches, was shot and instantly killed on Sunday night, the difficulty grew out of a dispute over a bill introduced by Patterson in his paper. WASHINGTON, 28.—The kingdom of Siam will expend about \$100,000 to display the products and industries at the Centennial. CHARLESTON, S. C., 28.—A large and enthusiastic public meeting was held in this city this evening, in response to a call to sustain the action of Governor Chamberlain in refusing to surrender to the Whig and Moser. Resolutions were unanimously adopted denouncing the action of the Legislature in electing them, protesting against their elevation to the bench, and avowing an unalterable purpose never to allow them to occupy the position. The resolutions further declare that the colored people shall be protected in all rights and privileges guaranteed by the constitution and laws, and that no circumstances shall prevail.

SAN FRANCISCO, 28.—The British ship *Esmeralda* arrived today from New Orleans, N. E. W., having on board 2500 tons of sugar, a crew of the British ship *Kandah*, which left here August 14th, for Liverpool. On the night of September 25th, 1875, a fire broke out on board, and the ship was totally lost; the crew escaped in boats, reaching Pitcairn's Island September 28th. On November 18th, the ship was taken up by the *Esmeralda*, except one seaman, Peter Butler, an American, who chose to remain on the island. Want Railroad Communication with Salt Lake. An official survey of the steamer *City of Mexico*, today, found the vessel in satisfactory condition. A dispatch from Los Angeles says that a meeting was held last night, to take steps to extend the Los Angeles and Independence railroad to connect with the Union Pacific; a letter was read from Senator Jones, promising co-operation. A committee was appointed to proceed to Salt Lake in the interest of the road. FOREIGN. FRANCE. The President Thiers has written a letter reserving the right of choosing between the Senate and Chamber of Deputies if he should be elected to both houses; he adds that all his wishes are for the establishment of a conservative republic. The Assembly continues to consider the press bill in detail, and has adopted all as far as the fourth clause. An amendment has been carried depriving the president of the power of summarily forbidding the sale of journals in the streets; the consequence will be to cancel the orders now in force by which the sale of seventy-five journals in the streets is prohibited. SPAIN. Military Movements. SAN SEBASTIAN, 28.—Considerable reinforcements have been sent to Hernani. Operations in Guipuzcoa will begin immediately. How Chinese Criminals are Punished. Hon. John M. Francis writes from Shanghai to his paper, the *Troy Times*, an interesting account of his observations among the Chinese. One of his most interesting experiences was a visit to the Chinese court, where a magistrate was dispensing justice to criminals. Prisoners who were arraigned prostrated themselves upon their knees before him, and were allowed to plead their defense. The magistrate examined prisoners and witnesses; no form of oath was employed. The cases were rapidly disposed of; some were discharged, others were sentenced to imprisonment for specified terms. One fellow, who had stolen twenty-four cents, was sentenced to receive two hundred blows with the bamboo and to be manacled and gagged in a public street for four weeks. Then a man was brought up charged with stealing a horse. The magistrate made his statement, upon his knees and begged for mercy. The magistrate sentenced him to be hanged at once in the court room, and three hundred blows were laid on, and he was manacled for six weeks. The court order made proclamation in loud, shrill tones, and four lieutenants at once carried away the prisoner, the man was taken by the lieutenants, placed upon the floor, face downward, stripped of his pantaloons, his hands were bound behind his back, and he was manacled. The prisoner was brought up charged with stealing a horse. The magistrate made his statement, upon his knees and begged for mercy. The magistrate sentenced him to be hanged at once in the court room, and three hundred blows were laid on, and he was manacled for six weeks.
