KEY WEST, Fla., 31.—The following particulars of the burning of the Missouri have been obtained from the survivors who have arrived here:

When the boat with the saved left the burning ship, one boat was seen keel upward with two men on it. The boat with the survivors had been swamped boat, containing nine men, including the engineers, the firemen, and the ship's barber. A bucket given to the inmates of the swamped boat to bail with, there being two in the rescued boat. As there were no seamen in the swamped boat, they were unable to properly manage it, and in his opinion, the boat was lost. It is not likely any of them were saved. No sail had been seen for two days previous to the fire. On that day the Missouri was in company with a ship from 9:15 a.m. till 3 p.m., when she was lost sight of for forty minutes. After the rescued left, the Missouri saw the passengers and crew who remained on board crowded on the after part of the ship. It is said the wood was first discovered on the floor of the locker in the pantry, and the alarm was immediately given, and wet carpets put on the fire by the pantryman and others, and the steward reported to the passengers that the fire was out. The alarm was given while the passengers were at breakfast, but on hearing the alarm, they stopped the breakfast, were resuscitated and then quieted. Within two minutes, however, several voices screamed "fire" from the stoke hole, and all was then confusion. Within twenty minutes three boats were launched. In the rescued boat, with the exception of a few pieces of sugar-cane that was neither food nor drink, all were wet, worn out, and a large one. There were no sails nor anything to make them of. It was from 9 o'clock on the 22nd until 2 o'clock in the afternoon of the 23rd before assistance was obtained. At that time the schooner Spy was sighted, and the rescued party pulled vigorously to her. The Spy took the survivors to Hoptown on the elbow of the key, where they arrived about 7 p.m. on the 23rd. On the 24th a schooner was sent towards the burning ship with charts and full directions where to find her, and with instructions to go to the aid of the boat and to skirt the reefs. The schooner returned about midnight on the 24th and reported having seen nothing of the boats or passengers. The sea was then breaking heavily on the reefs. The party left Hoptown on the 25th and arrived at Nassau on the 26th. It is said that the donkey pumps of the steamer were never stopped, one of the passengers writing he had had a hole for some time, but that no water was forced through it on the flames. At two the deck pumps were worked a few minutes only. Within fifteen minutes after the alarm was given twelve of the survivors were in the boat, and the flames were coming from the stoke hole in the engine room. The engine house was never allowed to burn, and making it too hot to get the others off. Only three boats were launched, two of which were swamped. It is said seven women and seven children were aboard and none got into the boats. The engines were stopped, and the pumps were stopped, and of our boats an hour and a half maintained. When last Captain Greene was working with the pump, Hampstead, and some of the crew, trying to get off the ice boat, surrounded by smoke and flames. Believe of the survivorship that the boat was never launched, but the twelfth Captain Culmer, says it was but was immediately swamped.
