CONGRESSIONAL.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 19.—The House

bill relating to the claim of agents

and attorneys in pension cases

passed. It makes it unlawful for

any attorney, agent or other person

to demand or receive for services in

a pension case a greater sum than

\$10, and provides that no fee con-

tract shall hereafter be filed with

the commissioner of pensions in

any case.

A concurrent resolution extend-

ing the session until 10 o'clock

p. m. was agreed to.

Voorhees said the House bill to

authorize the payment of customs

and after the 1st of October, had

just been received from the House.

He moved that the bill be laid

aside temporarily for the purpose

of considering that bill.

Conkling made the point of or-

der that the bill must be laid

before the Senate in the morning

hour.

The president sustained the

point.

Voorhees appealed from the de-

cision of the chair, but subsequent-

ly withdrew the appeal.

The president pro tem said that

since examining it, he found that

the bill had come to the Senate

since the expiration of the

morning hour, therefore it would

be in order to submit it to the Sen-

ate now.

After discussion as to the rules of

the Senate, Voorhees moved to lay

aside the pending order, being

the calendar, and call for the

purpose of taking up the

House bill to provide for the pay-

ment of customs duties on goods
