

The Porte is sending troops and ammunition to the Greek frontier. Unless the Turks retire to the new frontier, war is certain.

Further decrees against unauthorized orders in France have been postponed to Wednesday, on account of festivals of all saints and all souls.

Over \$200,000 has been bet in Nashville by sporting men, and a like amount at Memphis, that Weight would beat Wilson for Governor.

Another terrific hurricane, accompanied by a blinding storm, has passed over Denmark. The railways are blocked and a score of wrecks reported.

The Peruvian Guano Company of London received a telegram from Chili, Oct. 28, that negotiations for peace between Chili and Peru were fruitless.

The Prince of Montenegro, seeing the settlement of the Dulcigno question is likely to be indefinitely postponed, resolved to go away for the winter.

The invader, Payne, is in Wichita, Ks., also Capt. Pardee, of the 33d Infantry, who has 52 soldiers and 25 Indian scouts to repel the invasion of Oklahoma.

News is received from the west coast of Africa of the death of Chaca, Governor of Whydah. The funeral was to be celebrated by a massacre of natives.

Ulysses S. Grant, jr. was to-day married to Fannie J. Chaffee, only child of Senator B. Chaffee, of Colorado. The marriage was celebrated at 26 West 58th Street, New York.

The decrease in the shipments of wheat has led to an increase in the visible supply of wheat of 1,716,000 bushels. The visible supply of corn has decreased 867,000 bushels.

The latest news from Cabul received at Simla is entirely satisfactory. It does not support the rumor prevalent last week of the murder of the Ameer and a reign of anarchy.

The six days' contest for the Astley Belt began this morning at Agricultural Hall, London. Rowell accomplished the unprecedented feat of running 50 miles in 6 hours and 38 minutes.

By an accident on the Panhandle Railroad, yesterday afternoon, by which the east and west bound passenger trains collided, three men were killed and also three slightly injured.

Parnell visited Limerick to-day. He was met a mile from town by a reception committee and the corporation and was escorted by a procession of 50,000 people, including 3,000 horsemen.

The Sultan stated in a recent conversation he thought the misunderstanding between the Porte and England was purely transitory and hoped friendly relations would soon be restored.

Dervish Pasha has been authorized by the Porte to arrest the Albanian chiefs opposed to the transfer of Dulcigno and to remove from the district those who refuse to become Montenegrin subjects.

Republican specials are full of hope for Indiana, Kentucky and North Carolina. The first and last can be easily carried for the national ticket and the Kentucky congressional list is likely to be improved.

The approaching trials of the nihilists will be the most important that have yet taken place. The prisoner to be tried is the man who gave to the Nihilist committee all his property, amounting to 170,000 roubles, and who was tried at Kessla in 1879.
