The Porte is sending troops and ammunition to the Greek frontier. Unless the Turks retire to the new frontier, war is certain.

A sculling match between Lacock, of Australia, and Hosmer, of Boston, for £200, the Bostonian was easily defeated by three lengths.

Merrick Woodworth, of Pueblo, Col., aged 50 years, narrowly escaped lynching for being found in bed with his daughter, aged 13.

Further decrees against unauthorized orders in France have been postponed to Wednesday, on account of festivals of all saints and all souls.

The President and Mrs. Hayes arrived at Fremont, Ohio, at 1.30 this morning. The President will go to Washington probably on Thursday.

Parnell, speaking at Tipperary said if the people would only organize, it would be impossible to get enough police to intimidate the whole country.

Another terrific hurricane, accompanied by a blinding storm, has passed over Denmark. The railways are blocked and a score of wrecks reported.

The Peruvian Guano Company of London received a telegram from Chili, Oct. 28, that negotiations for peace between Chili and Peru were fruitless.

The Prince of Montenegro, seeing the settlement of the Dulcigno question is likely to be indefinitely postponed, resolved to go away for the winter.

The invader, Payne, is in Wichita, Ks., also Capt. Pardee, of the 33d Infantry, who has 52 soldiers and 25 Indian scouts to repel the invasion of Oklohama.

News is received from the west coast of Africa of the death of Chaca, Governor of Whydahoe. The funeral was to be celebrated by a massacre of natives.

Ulysses S. Grant, jr. was to-day married to Fannie J. Chaffee, only child of Senator B. Chaffee, of Colorado. The marriage was celebrated at 26 West 58th Street, New York.
