FIRE IN COUNTY BUILDING.

Mysterious Blaze Breaks Out at Three O'clock Sunday Morning.

Fire, the origin of which is still unexplained, was discovered in the room occupied by the newspaper reporters in the city and county building Sunday morning about 3 o'clock, and the nuilding damaged to the extent of \$700 before the blaze could be extinguished.

Eugene Green, a colored porter at the Elks' club, who lives directly across from the city and county building, was first to discover the fire; unable to locate the watchman of the building, he aroused a neighbor to send in the alarm by telephone. The department answered promptly, to find the flames gaining headway, but held them back through efficient work.

Fireman O. E. Matty suffered a badly crushed foot, one of the sections of the extension ladder dropping upon it as he was carrying a line of hose to the upper rooms. Capt. Andrew Elkrin was also slightly injured in the same

As the reporters' room, which is located on the fourth floor on the east side of the building, is rarely occupied at right, the origin of the fire is something of a mystery, and the only assignable cause Chief Glore could give was that during the late afternoon someone had thrown a lighted cigar into one of the sawdust-filled cuspidores, where it smouldered until it broke out into a blaze. The janitor stated that when he had entered the room after the reporters left Saturday night he had seen no indication of fire.
