LOCAL BRIEFS.

Funeral of Henry Brown—The funeral of Henry Brown, who was killed Wednesday afternoon at Garfield in a ship accident, will take place at Garfield.

New Suburban District—John R. Smith has sold to Ashton & Jenkins, 12 1/2 acres, opposite the Country Club, and Prof. C. Smith has sold to them for \$1,000 an acre. The property will be improved and cut up into city building lots.

Attending Institutes—Prof. Levi Young of the State university has gone to Morgan, Prof. W. M. Stewart to Park City, and Prof. C. Smith to Provo, in attendance of Farmers' Institutes. State Supt. Nelson will be in Park City tomorrow.

Branch in Boise—Manager C. A. Quigley of the Studebaker company in this city, has arranged to establish a branch house at Boise, where \$100,000 worth of stock will be carried. The company will erect a warehouse and office building there to cost \$30,000.

Bloodhounds For Sheriff—Joseph C. Sharp is negotiating with the Whitcomb kennels of Wichita, Kan. for a set of bloodhounds. The animals he believes will be valuable in tracing fugitives in such places as Brigham Canyon among the Austrians, Italians and other foreigners.

WANT VIADUCT MOVED.
Council Holds Short Line Has Violated Its Franchise in Matter.

After an hour's discussion last night the committee on streets and engineering were unable to come to an agreement with the officials of the Oregon Short Line company as to the location of the viaduct for pedestrians. The committee want the present location changed but they have no idea where it can be placed without damaging the appearance of the new depot. The committee held that the railroad company violated its franchise in placing the bridge where it is now being constructed. The matter will come up before the council Monday night at which time it is hoped the location will be decided upon.

The streets committee appropriated \$500 to take T. Raleigh, street supervisor, to be expended in building up the banks of the Jordan river which has reached its highest point in years and is washing away its banks and flooding the residents out of their homes on both sides of the river. Work will be continued today to hold the river in check and Raleigh will ask for more money Monday night to carry on the work.

Utah Manufacturers' Association
Will Boost Home Products
At Big Exposition.

AT CHAMBER OF COMMERCE.

Booths, Bands and Free Lunches Are Scheduled Among the Features
To Entertain Visitors.

At the meeting of the directors of the Utah Manufacturers' association held last evening it was decided to boost Utah products and manufactures during the coming conference in a way that will attract the attention of all who come from the country, and also those who live in Salt Lake. A great industrial fair will be held from April 1 to 10, which will be called "Prosperity Fair" and the slogan of the day will be "Boost Utah and Buy Utah Products." The affair is to be well advertised and plans are now being made to properly take care of the crowds who will be here to be instructed in what the state is doing in the way of manufacturing.

The fair will be given in the Chamber of Commerce building, where booths will be fitted up for manufacturers to exhibit their products. It is proposed to have a band on hand every evening and those who visit the fair will be given plenty of opportunity to taste the exhibits exhibited, as well as to see the exhibits. Prices will be given away to visitors and the plan includes passes to the theater for the manufacturers. Nothing will be omitted it is said, that will help to promote a general good time and properly advertise Utah products.

JAMES K. GILLESPIE IS DEAD IN CHICAGO
Operation for Cancer of the Stomach Fails to Bring Relief Sought.

James K. Gillespie, a well known real estate man, is dead. A brief message to that effect was received yesterday afternoon from Chicago, to which place Mr. Gillespie went a short time ago to have an operation performed for cancer of the stomach. The operation was performed at St. Luke's hospital under the direction of a specialist. In spite of all that could be done, however, the unfortunate sufferer died. It was known several days ago that he was marked for death, and the announcement that the end had come yesterday morning was not surprising. Mr. Gillespie has been in the real estate business for many years. He was a member of the old firm of Kelley & Gillespie from 1833 to 1881. During that year he went into business for himself until 1888, when he formed a partnership with Lewis B. Kelley and C. E. Pomeroy. When Mr. Pomeroy retired a few months later the firm continued under the name of Kelley & Gillespie up to the present. During the years between 1888 and 1891 the firm made a good deal of money, but the panic of 1892 hit them hard and practically all their accumulations were lost in the period of depression which followed.

Among the valuable holdings of the firm at one time may be mentioned the Commercial club property and the corner at West Temple and Second South streets. Some of the big deals promoted by the firm were the sale of the St. James corner, the Metropolitan corner, the Knutsford corner, the Eagle corner, the Commercial block corner and others.

Mr. Gillespie was born in Toledo City, Ohio, Dec. 31, 1837. He has three children, Helen G. Cates, wife of Louis B. Cates of Salt Lake; Allan Gillespie, aged 25, and Walter Gillespie, aged 18. He is also survived by a widow and one sister. His brother who has been dead some years, was also afflicted with cancer. The body will be brought to Salt Lake for interment.
