FALL River, Mass., Aug. 7.—In

AN ENTREPRENEUR QUESTIONS.

What Do With the Crew of an Amer-
ican Vessel.Washington, D. C., Aug. 7.—An
interesting question has been presented
to the treasury department by the
proprietors of New York and
"City of Paris" the owners of
which are preparing to have them
demolished as American vessels in
accordance with the recent
act of Congress granting them
the privilege under certain conditions.
The ownership company anxious to
have the present complement of offi-
cials removed from the vessel,
as, of foreign nationality, and
is to bring them within the law
regarding vessels of the United States
and the capacity by which
the United States can make
such a vessel secure its special
nationalization. This, however, is a very
showy process. The owners in question
have already agreed to sell the
vessel to the French, and it is
expected to be sold to the French
before the preliminary period
before they become full-fledged citi-
zens. Leaving out the question
of French nationality for the
period, the inquiry then is if it is
willing to exercise them for
such a vessel.
