SAUCER CARD WAS FULL OF FEATURES

Close Finishes, Pretty Races, Surprises and Other Things Combined To Keep Interest Stirred.

Ray Duer was not the only feature at the saucer track last night, for there were three others that kept the fans on their feet, cheering and shouting so that the cry of the "apiers" on the ground were utterly lost in the merry din. It was a card filled with interesting events and by far the best met of the season. No record was glimmering, and in this respect the evening was somewhat out of the ordinary.

The sensational ride of Iver Lawson in the two-mile lap was one of the slightest worth the feeling. Downing and Samson put up a hub and hub finish in the quarter open that was as pretty a fight for the fans as has ever been seen. When Devonovitch went after the bunch in the three-cornered team, the pursuit, but on the card for filler, there was sport for the fans that kept them in the air until the finish. The bunch put up the best light he has ever figured in on the local track, and the race throughout, instead of being as uninteresting as others usually are, was one of the good features of the evening.

It was a pretty race, too, for the two-mile lap, handicap and then the light began. Lawson's fight for the lap was perhaps the one big feature of the card and the leaders were closely pressed to the finish. Lawson won by a length from Walker with Hehr and Nesbitt in the rear guard.

Eight starters appeared for the quarter open with Bardgett and Nesbitt withdrawn. Downing had the lead all the way through until the last sprint when Samson with a kick at his heels pressed him close and finished him and won. When Bardgett and Nesbitt were put on, the race for the concrete for some little time was a bad start. Bardgett had a good lead, but he lost it when Nesbitt came up from the rear and beat him out by a length.

Phil Wright was glittering with trophies at the close of last night's meet, having captured the three-mile lap, handicap and the two-mile open. The summary:
