

EDITORIAL NOTES.

The Cincinnati Times, published in the Porkopolis of America says: "Congress could not then declare it a penitentiary. How would that do? Congress could build a wall round Cincinnati and declare it a hog pen. How would that do?"

The latest decision of astronomers in regard to the mean distance of the sun from the earth is 93,101,000 miles. This determination has been reached by a computation of the solar parallax from calculations of the distance of Mars from the earth, based on the observations of David Gill, of England, who went to Ascension Island for the purpose in 1877, and the equatorial semi-diameter of the earth determined by Col. Clarke. Prof. Newcomb and Leverrier, differ slightly from Gill in their conclusions, as also with each other.

A new impostor, or religious fanatic has made his appearance in the neighborhood of London. He announces himself as Elijah the Prophet. He claims to be the forerunner of the Day of Judgment, which, he declares is upon us, and he points to the thunder-laden sky and perishing crops as evidence of evil. His outer garment is a sheep's skin; and written upon photographs which are sold of him are references to the fourth chapter of Malachi, particular stress being laid upon the words, "Behold, I send you Elijah the prophet, before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord." The Saints understand that Elijah has already come, having appeared to Joseph the seer in the Kirtland Temple.

The American Antiquarian is an illustrated quarterly magazine published by Jameson and Moore, 164 Clark Street, Chicago, at \$3 per annum. It is devoted to a very interesting subject. It is well known that there are many evidences of ancient occupation of this continent, by a people whose history has always been enveloped in great mystery. New facts are, however, constantly coming to light which, though strange and sometimes mysterious are calculated to reveal something of the prehistoric condition of America. Travelers and explorers go to distant regions of the east to examine the ruins of Nineveh and Babylon, and in these buried cities find many confirmations of history; others, also, traverse the frozen regions of the Arctic Sea, to discover the Northwest Passage; but at our very doors there are the tokens of a buried past which deserve attention more than these. It is the object of the American Antiquarian to collect fact and direct inquiry, that this obscure history of our country shall be made known and the problem of man be ultimately solved. The editor, Rev. S. D. Peet, has devoted many years to this subject, and the contributors are all gentlemen who have high rank in the scientific world. The editor desires correspondence on evidences of the migration of the American races from other parts of the world. We refer him to the Book of Mormon, the only authentic history of their origin.

WOMAN IN MEDICINE.

The State Medical Society of Massachusetts, whose headquarters are in Boston, has recently disposed of a question which has been discussed and agitated among its members for ten years past. The admission of women to membership has been a subject of frequent dispute during that period, but ladies seeking admission have been invariably turned away. At length a meeting of the Council has been held and the Board of Censors instructed to examine all female applicants. This is quite a victory for the cause of woman, and its example will no doubt have an effect upon other medical bodies too strongly tinged with conservatism.

The subject of woman's adaptability to the practice of medicine has obtained great prominence during the past few years, and it is now pretty generally conceded that in some branches any lady may become thoroughly proficient and especially useful.

The International Review for October contains an article on this subject, from the pen of Dr. James R. Chadwick, in which it is shown that the earliest records of the world's history contain testimony of the successful practice of medicine by women, and that mythology joins history in crediting women with the capacity for the important branch of knowledge and skill. The author presents the annexed summary of inference to be drawn from his investigation:

(1) That there is a widespread and ever-growing movement in all parts of the world in favor of allowing women to study and practice medicine.

(2) That their claims for admission to the existing medical schools for man have in many instances been conceded, even in countries like Germany, where there is no considerable number of applicants for the privilege.

(3) That nowhere, except in Zurich during the two centuries of the Roman invasion, have the predicted social, moral, or educational calamities befallen the colleges of medicine, where there is no considerable number of applicants for the privilege.

(4) That the extent and force of the demand for the medical education of women in the several countries is in direct ratio to the general enlightenment of the people, finding its loudest expression in England, and notably in America.

Women are entering into the

practice of medicine all over the country. There are many, especially those acting as midwives, who are ignorant of anatomy, physiology and the established principles of medical science. Should not the way be opened for the acquisition by women of the knowledge which is essential to safe and successful practice? We think so, and that the public should be protected against charlatanisms whether in male or female, and therefore hope that the course of the Medical Society at Boston will be limited in other parts of the world, that one of the barriers in the way of woman's progress may be broken down, and no plea be left as an excuse for the medical or surgical ignorance of female practitioners any more than of male doctors legislation against quackery will be the next thing in order.

"BY THEIR FRUITS YE SHALL KNOW THEM."

"Christian" people appear very anxious to introduce their so-called civilization into Utah, and establish its usage among the "Mormons." Stories of "Mormon" depravity have been freely concocted and widely circulated, until many people in different lands have an idea that Utah is a hotbed of impurity; while the fact is, that there is no spot on earth where there is less crime and violence according to the population, and that if the "Christian" portion of its inhabitants were to be removed, with the influences, accessories and concomitants of their system, there would be scarcely a vestige left of the evils which commonly abound in the great centers of modern civilization.

It is not often that "Christian" papers tell the truth about their own institutions and condition, but the following, which we clip from the Hartford Religious Journal, briefly pictures the condition of Christendom in true colors:

"We have much to say at times about the abominations of the heathen, but we need go no further from home than the precincts of our large cities to find a depth of degradation equal to that of any heathen people on the globe. Vagrant children are becoming the blight and curse of society. Almost before their speech has dropped the lips of infancy, says a report of one of our Juvenile Asylums, they roll over the threshold of the paternal den and are with children of like condition. What one lacks in knowledge of blasphemy, rivalry, lying, cheating and obscenity, the other soon supplies. They are companions in all evil, frequent the same cook-pits and gambling halls, riot in the same brothels, yell at the same theatres, are locked in the same dungeons, and finally rot in the same trenches. It is high time that we used more vigor of administrative wisdom and less charitable patronage in meeting this evil."

Now, ye self-righteous, canting, anti-"Mormon" pharisees, look at the filthiness of your own skirts and the horrors of your own cities, and before you think of reforming a people who have separated themselves from your presence to partake not of your iniquities, turn your attention to the damning evils that are part and parcel of your own social system, and the offshoots of the boasted civilization which you seek to foist upon Utah and the "Mormons." And remember that the hellish fruits described by one of your own journals are not the products of the vine of polygamy, but are grown on your own much-vaunted, monogamous, Christiania vineyard. Yesterday, two after the careful culture of ages, the plan which you seek to compel us to adopt. Look at them and consider!

Newark Election.

NEWARK, N. J., 15.—Full returns from the election of Mayor, Democrat and Liberal, 3,887 over Macknet, republican. Total, Fiedler 12,573, Macknet, 9,206, Robinson, greenback, 167.

One of the musketeers, who was seated with him, instead of a blank cartridge, Nelson was shot through the head.

The Election.

DAVERPORT, 15.—The State does not have about 400 plurality in the city and about 1,000 in the county. The result is a landslide for the Democrats. The Republicans lost the legislative and county clerk.

show large democratic gains in several counties of the State. The chairman of the republican executive committee claims the election of Foster by 25,000 majority and thinks that the republicans will elect a majority in the members of the general assembly.

1.40 a.m.—At this hour we have returns of the vote for governor from over one-fourth of the State, and indicate a republican gain of 7,400, and indicate a republican majority in the State of not less than 25,000.

Definite returns of the result on members of the legislature have not been received and the legislature is claimed by both parties with chances in favor of the republicans.

Reports from all the precincts of Hamilton County, except 10, give Foster 3,800 majority. Over 100,000 republican for auditor, 2,699 majority. The republican majority on the State senatorial ticket ranges from 3,520 to 3,538, in representative 1,419 to 3,785. Geo. W. Williams, colored republican candidate for the legislature received the lowest republican vote, which was 303 more than the highest democratic record. As for the State at large, the estimates give a majority for the republican ticket of 25,000. It is very generally conceded that the republicans will have a clear majority in the general assembly of the legislature and indications are that later returns will give them a majority in each house.

FOREIGN.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Foreign Notes.

LONDON, 15.—Field Marshal Count von Montevideo of the German army, has reported to the Emperor that a considerable increase of the military defenses of Alsace-Lorraine will be necessary. The Russian press is very impatient about the death of news from the Central Asian expedition, especially as no effort has yet been made to reconcile the apparent contradictions and official reports of the action at Geoktepe. Meanwhile a letter from Tiflis, published in the Gokos, says: Grave apprehensions are felt there for the safety of the expedition. The letter describes the invalid men arriving at Baku as being in a miserable state and says that a number of them have died of diphtheria and scurvy diseases and that medical necessities were insufficient. The truth about the Geoktepe affair is gradually making out. The assault on the Dargilep earthworks was made on the Plevna pattern and after an ineffectual cannonade the Russians made a rush with fixed bayonets, but were repulsed and retreated in disorder. The Turcoman cavalry, attacking the Russian flank and rear, created such confusion that when the vanguard reached the main force in reserve, the latter was unable to stem the tide of retreat and was itself compelled to retire 40 miles before order was restored. According to private intelligence received in St. Petersburg, the Russian loss is much greater than the official reports admit.
