Washington, Nov. 30, 1887.

PROPOSALS for conveying the mails of the United States from July 1, 1888 to June 30, 1890, on the following routes in the Territory of Utah, will be received at the Contract Office of this Department until 3 p.m. of March 31, 1888, to be decided by April 15, following:

16633 From Huntsville to Bennington, (no office,) 120 miles and back, once a week. Leave Huntsville Monday at 6 a.m.; Arrive at Bennington Wednesday by 6 p.m.

Leave Bennington Thursday at 6 a.m.; Arrive at Huntsville Saturday by 6 p.m.

16634 From Beaver, by Greenville, Minerville, and Panaca, to Hiko, (Nevada,) 195 miles and back, once a week.

Leave Beaver Tuesday at 8 a.m.; Arrive at Hiko Friday by 8 p.m.

Leave Hiko Monday at 8 a.m.; Arrive at Beaver Thursday by 8 p.m.

Proposals for twice and also for three-times-a-week service invited.

NOTES.

Proposals must be to carry the mail with "celerity, certainty, and security," using the terms of the law, and they must be guaranteed by two responsible persons, certified to as such by a postmaster or judge of the court of record.
