Lectures by Mrs. Romanina—Mrs. Romanina, widow of John Romanina, the Oxford, Eng., naturalist, will speak on literary and religious subjects this evening at the residence of Bishop Spaulding, and Wednesday night she is to appear before the Rowland hall students.

To Tell of Swedish Strikers—Class A. Rolan of Sweden will speak Wednesday evening in Unity hall to union labor men, in aid of the 40,000 strikers in Sweden, locked out by the lumber, rime and smelting interests. The strikers think their cause is just, and have been aided by continental subscriptions. Assistance is now sought in this country.

MOTORMAN CUT BY GLASS.
Has Narrow Escape in Collision With Lumber Wagon Last Night.

Streeter No. 624, of the Murray line, in charge of Motorman J. W. Hooper, crashed into a lumber wagon stuck in the mud and extending across the tracks, at Tenth South and State streets, Monday night. The car was speeding at a high rate at the time, and the front was demolished by the force of the collision, while Hooper had a narrow escape from death, and his hands and face were badly cut by the flying glass. None of the passengers was injured. Hooper explained that he did not see the lumber wagon, although his car carried a powerful light. One of the team of horses attached to the wagon was so badly hurt that the police killed it out of pity.

HISTORIC OLD HOME TO BE RAZED SOON

Apartment Hotel to Cost \$100,000 to Be Built at First West and South Temple.

A new apartment hotel to cost in the neighborhood of \$100,000 is to be erected on First West and South Temple street. The building will be either four or five stories in height, of steel and reinforced concrete and brick. The ground upon which the new structure is to be erected was purchased at a cost of \$20,000.

The site is that which has been occupied for residence purposes for many years by Mrs. Harriet Amelia Folsom Young, and has been sought a number of times, unsuccessfully, by real estate investors. It is understood that the residence building is to be razed at once, and that active operations on the new structure will be carried on as the weather permits.
