

## DEATHS.

**McCULLOUGH.**—In Salt Lake City, February 26th, 1884, of paralysis, Elizabeth, relict of Thomas McCullough. Was born in Cecil County, Maryland, on the 26th day of December, 1801, and was consequently in the eighty-third year of her age. She embraced the Gospel at an early day in Centerville, Newcastle County, Delaware, emigrated to Utah in 1871 from Lancaster, Pa.

Funeral services will be held at the residence of her niece, Mrs. Angus M. Cannon, Fourteenth Ward, Wednesday, at 2 p. m. Friends are respectfully invited.

**DOPP.**—At Honeyville, February 20th, 1884, of dropsy, causing premature birth, Alta E. Rudd, wife of David Dopp, and daughter of Erastus H. and Eliza Dopp; born February 2d, 1840, in Adams County, Ill.; baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in 1853.
