Relative and Friends bid the Utah Troops in Affectionate and Sad Farewell.

Citizens of Salt Lake to the number of several thousand were at the Oregon Short Line depot last evening to bid the gallant Utah troops of the regular riding rifle regiment an affectionate farewell. The loving-lane was perhaps the saddest ever witnessed in Utah. For an hour or more, great throngs of people crowded about the brave boys, rendered the gratifying words of encouragement and greeted them for their patriotic performance of a grave public duty. In the eyes of the assembled multitude every soldier who was already an hero, entitled to all that was meritorious and good.

A remarkable feature of the one that produced a very strong effect upon all present was the absence of music. No band was present and not a tune was played. That the courageous and distinguished troops of the regular riding rifle regiment of the United States should have been permitted to depart without the results of a simple national air or even the presence of a drum corps is most regrettable and shows a lack of thought in the part of some one.

But the boys themselves, while actually realizing the gravity of their mission, were not depressed and while in their power to cheer up and reassure those who had gathered to see them go, they did so. Fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters and friends, who were present, were not without their own share of emotion. Many a brave soldier was seen to shed a tear as he bade his loved ones adieu.
